

Ship Napoleon Pacific Ocean, James A. Brownell Master.

Saturday Nov 21<sup>st</sup> 1857

Moderate breezes from the southward, heading to the S.W. Employed  
bailing. At 8 A.M. wore ship to the E by S.  
Keweenaw Island bearing to by S Dist. 40  
miles. Latter part strong winds and squally.

Lat 1-14 Long 11-04

Sunday Nov 22<sup>nd</sup>

Strong winds and squally from the S.E. heading  
to the S.W. Latter part strong winds. At 11 A.M. double reefed  
fore and main top sails.

Lat 1-44 S. Long 89-52

Monday Nov 23<sup>rd</sup>

Strong winds from the southward, steering to the wind  
to the eastward. Latter part strong wind. At 5 A.M.  
wore ship to the westward. Saw one Fin Back.

Lat 1-01 Long

Tuesday Nov 24<sup>th</sup>

Strong winds from the southward, heading to the S.W.  
Saw one and main top sails double reefed.  
At 5 A.M. wore ship to the westward. Employed stowing down  
oil.

Lat 1-38 S Long

Wednesday Nov 25<sup>th</sup>

Strong winds. At 2 P.M. we finished stowing oil.  
At 6 P.M. wore ship to the S.W. Whales stowed 4 B.B.s.

At 7 P.M. raised whale. Javed. the S and S Boats struck  
and took their whale to the ship. Lat 1-32 Long 90-00

Thursday Nov 26<sup>th</sup>

Strong close reefed top sail breezes. At 2 P.M. we commenced  
cutting. Cut one and part of another. At 6 P.M. pushed down fore  
the night. Split the main top sail. At 10 P.M. finished cutting.  
I had very sore hands, and lame breast. Latter part employed  
bailing.

Lat 2-20 Long 90-19

Friday Nov 27<sup>th</sup>

Strong breezes from the southward heading to the S.W. Employed bailing  
saw Fin Back.

Saturday Nov 28<sup>th</sup> 1857

Moderate breezes from the southward, heading to the S.W.  
Employed bailing. Saw Fin Backs. At 5 P.M. wore  
ship. Latter part fine. At 8 A.M. finished bailing.  
Whales stowed up 50 B.B.s. Saw Porpoises.

Lat 2-20 Long 90-54

Sunday Nov 29<sup>th</sup>

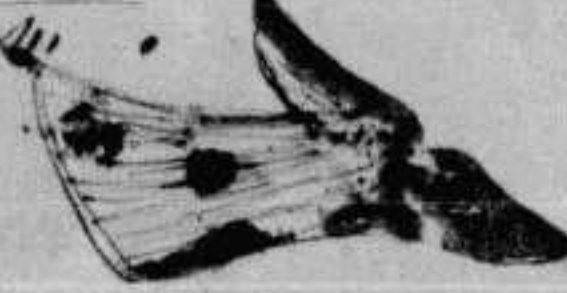
Pleasant breezes from the S.W. heading to the S.W. Saw few fish  
and Porpoises. Caught 2 Dolphin. Latter part fine.

Lat 2-01 Long 89-44

Monday Nov 30<sup>th</sup>

Pleasant breezes from the S.W. heading to the  
Eastward. At 5 P.M. raised sperm. Whales heading  
to the southward. We did not to them soon enough  
to lower. I am glad of it. Sunday whaling I do  
not believe in. Shortened sail. Latter part  
fine. Looked for the whales but did not find  
them.

Tuesday Dec 1<sup>st</sup> 1857

Moderate breezes from the southward, heading to the eastward.  
Saw Fin Backs. At 6 P.M. tacked to the N.W. At 5 A.M. wore  
to the eastward. Employed stowing down oil. At 9 A.M. raised  
whales. Javed. the boats all struck. 1 Boat got stove bad  
and lost her whale.

Wednesday Dec 2<sup>nd</sup> 1857

Moderate breezes. Took four whales to the ship. Lost  
2 more that we saw dead. At 6 A.M. commenced  
cutting. At noon finished. Lat 2-04 Long 89-44



Thursday Dec 3<sup>rd</sup> 1857

Moderate breezes from the southward, heading  
to the westward. Employed cutting & blubber  
and clearing heads. At 5 P.M. finished heads. and  
commenced bailing. At 10 A.M. saw one of the  
L B Boats whales and took it to the ship and  
cut it in.
