

Ship Napoleon Pacific Ocean. James A. Brown Master.

Thursday Feb 25th 1858

Begins with light breezes from S.E. heading
S.W. Saw plenty of Boobies,
and a man of war Hawk. A good sign that
land is near. Later part moderate breezes
from the S.W. Steering S.E. At the fore
Pop Mast, Lower and Main Pop. Sailed
standing sails. Lat Long

Friday Feb 26th

Begins with moderate breezes from the
S.W. steering S.E. Bent the main
spanker. Latter part strong S.E. At 2
A.M. the hauled to the Eastward.
At 1 took in all sail but Double Reefed
Main Pop Sail and Close Reefed Mizen.
and Storm sails.

Saturday Feb 27th

Begins with strong S.E. from the Eastward
steering to the Northward and short sail.
Latter part more moderate. Made some
sail. No Ob's

Sunday Feb 28th

Begins with strong winds from
the Eastward heading S.E. under Double
Reefed Pop sails. Latter part fresh breezes.
Another Sabbath is past and gone, and
with it the last day of winter. I hope
I shall be permitted to pass some Sabbaths
with my friends at home. Lat 30-37 Long 105-24

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Monday March 1st 1858

Begins with fresh breezes from the Eastward
steering S.E. under Double Reefs. At
6 P.M. made all sail. Wind more
moderate. hauled more to the Northward, head
S.E. Latter part moderate. Saw 8 B. fish.
Lat 31-50 Long

Tuesday March 2nd

Begins with light breezes from the Eastward
heading S.E. Latter part light air.
Lat 32-41 Long

Wednesday March 3rd

Begins with light air from the S.W.
heading S.E. Bent a new fore Pop sail.
Latter part calm. repairing the spanker.
Lat Long

Thursday March 4th

Begins with calms, bent the spanker
and a new main royal. Latter part
light air from the Westward. Course
S.E. Lat Long

Friday March 5th

Begins with light air from the westward.
Latter light air and baffling.
Lat Long

Saturday March 6th

Begins with calms. At 4 P.M. took a light
air from the S.W. I caught with a
dip net 29 beautiful fish, equal to our
smelts. Calms. Calms. Lat 33-41 Long 105-24

Sunday March 7th

Begins with calms. Latter part the same
Lat 33-50 Long
