Begins with light airs from the N.N.W. Course

S.E. by E. Later part light breezes from

N.N.W. Course East. Saw a Drugg Storing

S.E. boat and set the Mizen Mast.

Lat 34-53 Long 102-23

Wednesday March 10th

Begins with light breezes from the

Northward Course East. the Drugg in sight.

Later part pleasant breezes from N.N.W. started

water. we have now about 20 days water on board.

I hope we shall have no more calms. If we do

we shall be short before we get to Port.

Barometer very high, 31¹/₄ Lat 35-20 Long 100-48

Thursday March 11th

Begins with pleasant breezes from the

N.N.W. Course East. Saw a Drugg Storing

to the Southward. Later part pleasant breezes

Course E by N.

Lat 35-38 Long 98-25

Friday March 12th

Begins with pleasant breezes from the

N.N.W. Course, E by N. Saw a sail.

Later part pleasant breezes from the N.N.W.

Saw a sail Storing to the Southward.

Lat 35-48 Long 96-42

Saturday March 13th

Begins with pleasant breezes from the N.N.W.

Storing E by N. Saw two sails. Later part

strong winds. took in light sails

Sunday March 14th 1858

Begins with strong winds from N.W. by W.

Course E by N. Later strong winds and

squally. Single reefed the top sails and

furled the main sail. Barometer 29-6/10

Lat 36-21 Long 89-38

Monday March 15th

Begins with strong gale from the N.W.

and squally. Course, E.S.E. by E. At

1 P.M. furlled the main top sail, furled

the fore and mizen top sails. saw a

Drugg Storing to the Southward. Later part

strong gale Barometer 29-55 Lat 36-32 Long 86-43

Tuesday March 16th

Begins with strong gale from the

N.W. by W. Storing E.S.E. by E. under double

reefed top sails and wore sail. At

1 P.M. began to rain. At 5 P.M. the wind

hailed suddenly to the S.W.

Later part strong winds and rain.

Wednesday March 17th

Begins with strong winds and squally

from the Southward. and went a

new main top sail. Later part moderate

Lat 36-07 Long 82-07

Thursday March 18th

Begins with light breezes from the S.W. Storing

S.E. by N. Went a new main top sail.

Later part moderate breezes from the N.N.W.

Lat 36-16 Long 81-14

Friday March 19th

Begins with pleasant breezes from N.N.W.

Course, E by N. Later part fresh breezes.

Saw jumpers.

Lat 36-38 Long
