

Ship Napoleon Pacific Ocean, James A. Brownell Master

Saturday March 20th 1858  
Begins with pleasant breezes from N.W. steering  
S.E. & E. Saw Porpoises. Latter part moderate  
breezes from E. & N.E. heading S.E. at noon were  
Ship to the Northward Lat 37-04 Long 77-50

Sunday March 21st  
Begins with moderate breezes from E. & N.E.  
steering S. Latter part pleasant breezes  
from the S.E. heading E. & E. Lat 36-42 Long 77-25

Monday March 22nd  
Begins with pleasant breezes from S.E.  
steering by the wind E. & E. Saw a Barque  
steering to the Southward. Latter part fine.  
At 8 P.M. the wind hauled to the Northward. Set  
stuck sail and began to haul. Saw Black Fish  
and Pin Ducks. Saw a large ship steering N.E.  
Lat 36-35 Long 75-45

Tuesday March 23rd  
Begins with pleasant breezes from the Southward  
steering E. by N. Latter part fresh breezes  
and Breeze. At 8 P.M. came up a little raised  
the Land. Dist 30 miles. It was the Lays.  
At noon Palcahuano bearing E by N Dist 20 miles.

Wednesday March 24th  
Begins with moderate breezes from the  
S.W. steering E. by N. of the Passage. At  
6 P.M. the wind died away from the Westward  
and a light air sprang up from the S.E. with fog.  
Saw Palcahuano bearing S Dist 14 miles  
when we were ship off shore. Latter part light  
breezes from the Northward. At 9 P.M. Civil  
time came to anchor in Palcahuano, in 2 1/2  
fathoms of water.

Thursday March 25th 1858  
Pleasant weather wind from the Southward  
variously Employed. got off a raft of water.

Friday March 26th  
Pleasant weather got off some water

Saturday March 27th  
Pleasant weather. Various Employed  
in Ship's Duty. Discharge of Cruisers.

Sunday March 28th  
Pleasant breezes from the Southward.  
Sent a watch on Liberty

Monday March 29th  
Pleasant weather. The wind from  
the Southward hauled to the Northward  
At 6 P.M. let go second Anchor.

Tuesday March 30th  
Blowing a gale from the Northward and raining.

Wednesday March 31st  
Pleasant weather wind from the Southward  
took the second Anchor.

Friday April 1st  
Pleasant weather wind from the Southward.

Saturday April 2nd  
Fresh breezes from the Southward Employed  
Sailing. Sunday April 3rd  
Fresh breezes from the Southward.
