Begins with strong gales from the Northward
and rain. Staring S by E. Middle part
thick and rainy. Latter part more clear.
At 6 A.M. the hauled to the S.W. Set
the main. Pop. Salt sail.

Lat. 50-37 Obs 50-34 Long 81-40 Obs 81-25

Tuesday April 27th

Begins with fresh gales from N.W. Staring S by E
Under Double Reefed Main and Mizzen. Pop. Salt
Main Pop. Salt and Pop. Salt sail. At 6 P.
M. took in the Color main. Pop. Salt sail.
At 7 Double Reefed the main Pop. Salt sail. At 10
took in Fore sail, Fore and Mizzen. Pop. Salt
and gave the ship too heading S by E. Latter
part moderate Drizzle from Southward heading
S by E at Sail set. Beginning of the Day
Barometer 29.4/100.

Wednesday April 28th

Begins with moderate Drizzle from the Southward
heading S by E. At 6 P.M. Barometer 28.7/100
At 11 A.M. the wind hauled to the S.E. and
to the S.E. Barometer 28.85/100
Lat 53-03 Long 80-50 Lat Obs 53-04 Long 80-46

Thursday April 29th

Begins with fresh Drizzle from S.E. and
blowing. Middle and latter parts moderate
and Drizzle. heading to the Southward.
Barometer 28.6/100 Lat 54-01. Long 82-13.

Friday April 30th

Begins with light and baffling winds from Eastward.
heading S.W. Latter part - Calm saw a sail.

Saturday May 1st 1858

Begins with light Drizzle from the Westward.
Staring S by E. A ship in sight steering to the
Eastward. Barometer 28.4/100 Thermometer 43.
42 is the lowest it has been in the Cabin yet.
Latter part fresh gales from N.W. Ship still in sight.
Barometer 29.25/100 Lat 55-21 Long 77-38 Obs 55-20 Long 77-40

Sunday May 2nd 1858

Begins with fresh gales from N.W. Staring S by E.
Rozals and Pop. Salt and Salt sails hauled.
At 2 P.M. took in Mizzen. Pop. Salt sail, and Fore
Pop. Mast and sail. Given N.W. by N.
Latter part heavy gales from N.W. At 9 A.M.
have too under Close Reefed Main. Pop. Salt and
Main Spruce. heading N.E. Barometer 28.4/100
Thermometer 46. Lat 57-13 Long 76-18

Monday May 3rd

Begins with heavy gales from the N.W. and
a very bad sea. Rain. Ship too heading N.E.
Under Close Reefed Main. Pop. Salt. Fore and
Main Spruce. At 4 the wind began to haul.
and moderate Barometer 28.4/100 At mid
night the hauled back to the Northward and blew
on again. At 3 1/2 have too under Close Reefed Main.
Pop. Salt and Spruce. Saw a Drizzle
heading to the Eastward. Barometer 28.4/100

Lat 57.46 Long 74-51

Tuesday May 4th

Begins with fresh gales from the Northward heading
S by E. A Bark in sight heading as we are. At 4 P.
M. the Mizzen. Pop. Salt and Close Reefed. Barometer 28.4/100
At 5 A.M. the wind hauled to the Westward.
and blew fresh. Staring N.E. by E. Under Double
Reefed Pop. Sails. Barometer 28.4/100 Thermometer
48. Lat 57-57 Obs 57.40 Long 74.15 Obs 74.20
