

Ship Napoleon Atlantic Ocean, toward the Port

Sunday June 20th 1858
Begins with light pleasant breezes from
S.E. steering N.W. the Barque at 6 P.M.
was off our Star Beam. Latter squally
and variable, the Barque out of sight.
Lat 2-05 Long 37-15

Monday June 21st
Begins with light trades and variable,
from E to S.E. with occasional squalls
of rain. Course N.W. At 2 P.M. raised
a Barque 2 Points abaft our Star Beam.
steering about N by W. Latter part
fine breeze. At 4 1/2 P.M. crossed the
Line. We are now in the Ocean that
bounds the coast of our home.
Lat. 00-11 N. Long 38-07

Tuesday June 22nd
Begins with light trades from the
S.E. Course N.W. Latter part wind
S.E. steering N by W. Employed painting
in side aft, finished as far as the main
mast.
Lat 1-50 Long 40-11

Wednesday June 23rd
Begins with light breezes from S.E.
steering N by W. Latter part rain and baffling.
At 2 P.M. took in studding sails, the first time
for 8 days.
Lat 3-10 Long 40-46

Thursday June 24th
Begins with light and baffling airs, heading
at ways. Wind and latter part light
and changeable. Saw a Schooner.
Lat 4-11 Long 40-57

Friday June 25th 1858
Begins with light and changeable,
breezes from that all ways, and rain.
The Schooner in sight heading to the
Northward. Wind part light breezes from
the S.E. and very rainy. Latter part light
airs and calms. Lat 5-05 Long ...

Saturday June 26th
Begins with light airs and calms.
At 4 1/2 P.M. took a breeze from the
S.E. and rain with it of course. The
Schooner still in sight ahead. It is hard
living with old thick back now. He's
got a nasty little speck for a companion.
He's learning Spanish language. It is amusing,
and still disgusting to hear, and see them
perched up in the cabin, guffing and swallowing
guffing, choking, and showing their nonsense.
With a cigar in their mouths. I believe that
I have smoked one cigar with Capt. C. this
voyage. He is so bad since he's got that
P. M. A. companion, that he cannot
those that have served him the voyage, with
common civility. No O.K. -

Sunday June 27th
Begins with light and baffling winds
from N.E. to South, and squally. At 11 P.M. the
wind veered very heavy. Latter part fresh breeze
from the Eastward. Lat 7-06 Long 41-46

Monday June 28th
Begins with moderate breezes from the
Eastward and squally. At 7 P.M. the
wind veered to the Southward and rained
fast. Latter part changeable and squally.
Lat 8-04 Long 44-04
