Moderate Breezes since baffling. Steering
N. N. W. Lat 25-30 Long 63-56

Saturday July 10th
Begins with light breezes from
the Eastward, at 3 the wind shifted to the
S. S. E. at 6 began to rain. Course N. N. W.
Middle and latter part squally with thunder
and lightning. took in Studd sail. At 6 the
let the fore and main. Chop mast studd sails.
At 7 1/2 let the lower, fore and main. Chop
half studd sail. washed ship in side.

Sunday July 11th
Begins with pleasant breezes from
E. S. E. Course N. N. W. Latter part fine.
Saw one sail. Lat 28-32 Long 66-05

Monday July 12th
Begins with pleasant breezes from
the E. S. E. Course N. N. W. Latter part
moderate breeze. Employed painting.
Lat 30-17 Long 67-14

Tuesday July 13th
Begins with moderate breezes from E. S. E.
Course N. N. W. Employed painting inside.
Latter part fine Lat 31-45 Long 68-00

Wednesday July 14th
Begins with moderate breezes from the
Eastward and fine weather. I have been
painting Napoleon's profile under the Bow Sprit.
Latter part fine Steered the bit. down
between decks. saw a sail. heading North
Lat 33-24 Long 68-58

Thursday July 15th 1858
Begins with moderate breezes from Eastward
and squally. Course N. N. W. at sail let.
Latter part light and baffling winds. saw a
schooner steering to the N. W. probably from
the West Indies. Lat 34-53 Long 69-43

Friday July 16th
Begins with light and baffling winds
tripping to star. N. N. W. the schooner still
in sight. Latter part calm, plenty of light-
ning. Saw three sails. Lat 34-37 Long 70-16

Saturday July 17th
Begins with light sails from the Southward
Course N. by W. saw several sails. Latter
part moderate. Breezes from S. E. saw one sail.
Lat 35-43 Long 70-55

Sunday July 18th
Begins with moderate breezes from the S. E.
Course N. by W. saw one sail steering N. E.
Middle and latter part calm and light airs.
in the stream. Current N. E. and strong. Strong
N. E. Current. temperature of the water 85°.
Lat 37-20 Long 70-30

Monday July 19th
Begins with light breezes from the Northward,
steering to the Eastward. at 1 P. M. looked to the
Westward, saw a number of sails. we found
a cold place in the middle of the Gulf, the water
being five deg. colder than either side of it.
Lat 37-53 Long 71-28
