

Tuesday the first part strong gales from N^W
Jan 6th and a heavy sea heaving westward at
11 AM steard S E at 2 PM the wind hault
to the S and commenced blowing heavy
took in fore sail and fore topsails so ends
Lat 34° 30' N Lon by Ch 167° 30' W

Wednesday the first part blowing a complete gale
Jan 7th from N^W heading S E at 1 PM took
in main topsail and turned up the
laboard boat middle and latter the
same so ends this day Lat 34° 00'

Thursday the first part blowing a gale from
Jan 8th N^W at 7 PM the wind hault to S^W and
moderated gradually through the night at
daylight set the main topsail and steard
S E latter moderated some set fore top sail
and foresail so ends Lat by Obs 36° 15' N Lon 65° 45'

Friday the first strong winds from N^W and a heavy
Jan 9th sea running turned one reef out of main topsail
middle thick weather steard S E latter wind
began from W to S and rainey heading S E
when the wind would admit of it so ends
Lat by Obs 34° 40' N Lon by Ch 167° 30' W

Saturday the first part strong wind from S and
Jan 10th evening with thick rainey weather heading
eastward by the win middle wind canted
to N^W and blood fresh steard S E latter
moderated some turned one reef out of
the topsails so ends this day
Lat by Obs 34° 14' N Lon by Ch 57° 09' W

Monday Begins with strong Eastly wind
J. L. P. Steers by the wind heading S E
At 1 PM took in sail men
Employed in ship duty Lat 30°
Francis

Friday Sept 21th
Begins with strong wind from N^W by N made
All sail at daylight steering S E Men employed
In ship duty latter part light wind at sun down
took in sail huped up on the wind Lat 23° Lon 36° 18' W

Saturday Sept 22th
Begins with light wind from N^W at daylight
Made sail steering S E latter part the same men
Employed in ship duty very squally through the night
Saw the sail Lat 30°

Sunday Sept 23th
Begins with strong wind from S steering by the wind
Heading S E saw four sail men employed in
Ship duty middle part the same at sun down
took in sail so ends Lat 30°

Monday Sept 24th
Begins with strong wind from S E at day
Light made sail steering to the southward & westward
Men employed ship duty latter part the wind more
Moderate saw porpoises & one sail so ends

Tuesday Sept 25th
Begins with strong wind from the northward
And steard at daylight made all sail steering
S W at nine o'clock raised sperm whale boat
down the boats the Laboard boat stuck on
Brought him along side in the afternoon men
Employed in cutting him in at sun down took in
sail made things snug for the night so ends this day
Lat 23° 42' N Lon 34° 43' W
