

Wednesday Sept 26

Begins with light wind from Southward.
And eastward steering by the wind heading
N. O saw one whale finished cutting in started
The works at son down 44 ends Lat 24.18.50 Lon 34

Thursday Sept 27

Begins with wind from Southward & eastward heading
N. E middle part very rainy men employed
In trying out blubber saw some sail took in
The fore topsail at son down Lat 25.00.00 Lon 35

Friday Sept 28

Begins with a strong wind from the eastward.
Steering to the westward latter part the same
Lat 25.00.00 Lon 35
Son down took in the fore topsail men employed
In trying out blubber finish trying out sun
Nothing so ends this day Lat 25.00.00 Lon 35

Saturday Sept 29

Begins with strong wind from N. E steering
By the wind on the port tack heading N. E
Made all sail at day light men employed in
Ships duty latter part the same saw one
Fin back took in all the light sails and the
Fore top sail at son down 50 ends Lat 25.00.00 Lon 35

Sunday Sept 30

Begins with a strong wind from N. E heading N. E
At day light made sail heading to the southward and
Westward men employed in ships duty saw porpoises
And one sail took in the main sail & fore top sail at
Son down about 10 o'clock took in the fore sail & main
Very heavy rain squalls so ends Lat 25.00.00 Lon 35

Monday Oct 1st

Begins with a strong wind from N. E steering
I saw one sail latter part the same men employ
In ships duty at son took in the fore topsail
The fore sail very heavy heavy sea running
Through the night so ends Lat 25.00.00 Lon 35

Tuesday Oct 2

Begins with light wind from N. E steering
N. E at day light made all sail latter part the same
Saw one sail men employed in ships duty at son
Down reef the fore & main topsails hauled up the
Boards so ends Lat 25.00.00 Lon 35

Wednesday Oct 3

Begins with light wind from N. E steering by
The wind heading N. N. W middle and latter
The same men employed in stowing down the oil
Saw two sails saw some backs heard down the boat
Thinking that they were sperm whales came on board
Again took in all the light sails and the fore topsail
At 12 o'clock at night we ship heading to the northward
And eastward so ends this day Lat 25.00.00 Lon 35

Thursday Oct 4th

Begins with light wind from N. E steering
N. E at day light made all sail at 11 o'clock took in
Ship heading to westward men employed in ships duty
Middle part the same rainy through the night saw
Two sails so ends this day Lat 25.00.00 Lon 35

Friday Oct 5th 1864

Begins with wind from the N. E steering N. E
Middle part squally at son down took in the
Wind heading N. E took in fore topsail and
All of the light sails at son down men employed
on ships duty saw porpoises so ends Lat 25.00.00 Lon 35

Saturday Oct 6th

Begins with light wind from N. E at day light made
All sail and kept her off N. E at 12 o'clock took
Up on the wind on the port tack heading N. E saw
One sail men employed in ships duty latter part light
Winds with rain at son down took in all of the light sails
And the main sail & fore topsail light wind wind
Winds through the night so ends this day Lat 25.00.00 Lon 35
