Commenced with strong wind from N.W. & clearing
S.W. by S. Men employed in various duties Middle
and latter part strong wind & heavy rain squalls
from Southward & Eastward heading from S. E. to S. W. by S
At sun down took in the main sail fore top sail & put one
reef in the main top sail So ends this days work

Thursday Oct 31st
Commenced with a strong wind from S.E. & clearing
by the wind heading S.W. Middle part the same
Employed in various duties latter part more moderate at
sun down took in the fore top sail so ends

Friday Nov 1st 1866
Commenced with a strong breeze from the southward
S.W. Eastward clearing by the wind heading S.W. some
by S. E. by S. Employed in various duties
Middle part the same latter part more moderate heading
S.W. At sun down took in all the light sails & put
one reef in the fore & main top sails So ends

Saturday Nov 2nd
Commenced with a good breeze from S. clearing S. At
day light made all sail employed in various duties
Middle and latter part the same some squalls at times
One and halfed here on board At sun down took in the
light sails and the main sail and put one reef in the
main sail So ends this days work

Sunday Nov 3rd
Commenced with a full sail breeze from N.E. clearing
S. at day light made all sail employed in various duties
Middle and latter part the same At sun down took in
the main sail and fore top sail So ends

Monday Nov 4th
Commenced with a full sail breeze from the Northward and clearing
S. Middle and latter the same at sun down
took in all light sails and the main sail
And put one reef in the top sail so ends
This days work Lat 36. 30. Long 75. 00

Tuesday Nov 5th 1866
Commenced with thick and foggy weather wind from the
Northward & Westward clearing S. Employed in various
duties Middle and latter part wind from Southward & Westward
clearing S. Saw five backs through the day at sundown took in
all light sails & the fore top sail S. At Lat 36. 40. Long

Wednesday Nov 6th
Commenced with thick weather wind from the Northward
and Westward clearing S. Employed in various duties
Middle and latter part the same at sun down took in
all light sails main top sail so ends

Thursday Nov 7th
Commenced with thick weather wind from N.W. by
clearing N.E. At 10 O'clock A.M. Saw 5 sperm
whales leaved down the boats and chased them 8 or 10 miles
In thick fog and then we lost run of them came on board
made all sail stood along in the wind At sun down
took in all light sails main top sail & fore top sail
And fore top heading S.W. So ends Lat 36. 30. Long 75. 00

Friday Nov 8th
Commenced with thick weather wind from N.W. by
clearing by the wind heading N.E. by S. Employed in
various duties Middle and latter part the same at sun
down took in the main sail fore top sail fore top sail
And put two reefs in the main top sail Saw five backs
through the day so ends

Saturday Nov 9th
Commenced with a full sail wind from N.W. Middle
part the same employed in various duties latter part
more moderate wind from N.W. by S. So ends
This days work Lat 36. 30. Long 75. 00

Sunday Nov 10th
Commenced with a full sail breeze from S. E. by
clearing by the wind heading S.E. Middle part the
same Saw five backs & back fish through the day
latter part squally at sun down took in the main
sail fore top sail and put one reef in the main
top sail So ends this days work
