

Friday Nov 23th 1844

Commenced with a light wind from the Northward & Westward Steering by the wind heading to the Northward & Eastward employed in various duty Middle and Latter part Strong wind Saw one Seal And a number of Fin backs At 10 down took In the fore Top Sail

Saturday Nov 24th

Commenced with a Strong wind from N.E. Steer By the wind heading N.N.W. employed in various Dutys Middle & Latter part the same Saw one Seal And a few Fin backs through the day

Sunday Nov 25th

Commenced with a light wind from the Northward And Eastward Steering to the Northward on the barboard side Middle part the same Latter part more Moderate Saw one Seal and a number of Fin backs through the day To end

Monday Nov 26

Commenced with a Strong wind from N.W. Steering by the wind heading N.W. employed In various duties At 4 o'clock P.M. Saw Right Whales board down the boats and chased them but their was such heavy sea running could not get up To them came on board And stood along on the wind At 10 down took the main sail in And closed Reeft the fore Top Sail Leads Lat 37.00 Long 10.51 W

Tuesday Nov 27

Commenced with a light wind from N.W. Steering to Southward & Westward Saw whales At Six o'clock A.M. board down the boats And chase them but could not get on for them came on board Again made All Sail & stood along on the wind At three o'clock P.M. Saw more whales board down the boats again but did not get up Came on board Again And stood along on the wind heading to the Northward and Westward At 10 down took in the main sail and put one reef in the Top Sail Lat 37.00

Wednesday Nov 28th 1844

Commenced with a light breeze from the Northward And Westward Steering by the wind heading to the South And Westward Saw Right Whales three times through the day board down the boats the W.B. Boat went On And missed Came on board again made All Sail And stood along on the wind at 10 down took in All Light Sail put one reef in the top sail And pulled the main sail Lat 36.25 Long 11.10 W

Thursday Nov 29th

Commenced with a light wind from the Northward And Eastward made All Sail At daylight Saw Right Whales three times through the day the L.B. Went on And struck and turned her up with line Along side And commenced getting things ready to bat him in took in All light Sails And the main sail for Top sail made through stow for the night To end Lat 36.00 Long 11.00

Friday Nov 30th

Commenced with a Strong wind from the Northward & Westward heading to Northward And Eastward employed in cutting in the whale finished cutting At 12 o'clock started the work At 4 o'clock P.M. To end

Saturday Dec 1st 1844

Commenced with a light wind from the Westward Steering S.W. under All sail employed in trying out blubber Middle And latter part the same Saw one Seal through the day took in All light Sails At 10 down To end

Sunday Dec 2nd

Commenced with a light wind from the North And Eastward Steering by the wind with All Sail out heading to the Northward & Westward employed in trying out Middle part the same Latter part Strong wind took in all light Sails for Top sail close hauled the main Top sail one reef in the fore sail finish trying out at 4 o'clock P.M. To end
