Thursday Feb the 21

All this day a fresh trade wind squally weather steering S by W with a rough sea So Ende Feb 19, 48 Long 89 45 I.R.

Friday Feb the 22

All this day fine clear weather steering S by W Lat at noon by Obs being 16 32.8 So Ende this day

Saturday Feb the 23

All this day fine clear weather and moderate at 7 P.M. took in sail at 11 have two at 4 A.M. hauled the gill and kept off S.W. turned the boats over and got ready to put them out So Ende this day Lat 15, 39.5

Sunday Feb the 24

First part of this day begins with a light breeze and clear weather put the boats out at 5 P.M. saw the *Scleropharynx* bearing W distance 12 miles hauled up W's W at midnight hauled in around the north point and have two at daylight made sail and beat up into *prince Rupert* bay at 10 A.M. came to anchor furlled the sail and separated So Ende

Monday Feb the 25

All this day fine weather laying at anchor in *prince Rupert* bay all hands employed in ship's duty So Ende this day

Tuesday Feb 27

All this day fine weather laying at anchor all hands employed in ship's duty So Ende this day

Wednesday Feb 28

First part of this day laying at anchor with fine weather. Middle part squally of rain with calm at 10 A.M. got under weigh and steered to the S.E. with light and hazy wind So Ende

Thursday March 1 1866

First part of this day became unbecomingly later has become under *M. Martinique* saw two hump backs So Ende this day

Friday March 2

First part of this day begins with a fine breeze from the S.E. steering over towards St. Lucia. Middle part moderate beating up towards the weather end of St. Lucia later part made the same So Ende this day

Saturday March the 3

All this day fine weather saw black fish however and got three at 7 P.M. came to anchor under St. Lucia with the *Estrella* G.W. Lewis and *Cetaria* at 4 A.M. got under weigh at 8 A.M. came to anchor in *Castor* So Ende this day
