 Sunday July the 3rd 1866
 First part of this day began
 with a fine breeze and hazy weather
 at 10 still saw sperm Whales
 however for them in company with
 S. L. Wright and Alexander at 2
 P.M. it came on squally the Whales
 going quick all the time at 5
 came on board and gave it up and
 came at 5 a light breeze from
 the E. S. E. at 12 fresh breeze
 the same

Monday July 7
 First part of this day a fresh
 breeze and rough weather from the
 Eastward at 10 still kept the
 main sail at 5 P.M. saw the
 on starting looked to the S. E.
 and turned the reefs out of
 main sail at 8 took in the
 flying Lib. So ended the

Tuesday July 10
 All this day a smart breeze
 from the E. S. E. standing by the
 first on one tack and then on
 other saw a number of whales
 beating out of the Gulf So ended the

Wednesday July the 11
 All this day a smart breeze
 from the E. S. E. standing by the
 main tack and took at 8 P.M.
 made a fire and boiled out the
 black fish at 8 P.M. Lat 24 55
 S. at 3 P.M. saw Caspary's reef
 light took ship off shore the
 first mate So ended

 Thursday July the 12 1866
 All this day light air and calm
 saw seven or eight sail of vessels standing
 to the East at 10 a light breeze from
 the E. S. E. standing South

Friday July 13
 All this day a light breeze standing
 South by East at 5 P.M. spoke with
 S. L. Wright saw a number of vessels
 standing South at 8 took in the main
 sail and set the by sail So ended the

Saturday July 14
 All this day a light breeze from
 the Southward standing by the
 wind to the Eastward in company
 with the S. L. Wright until all
 sail at sunset took in sail for
 the night So ended this day
 the Lat 25 30

Sunday July 15
 All this day a fine breeze from
 the E. S. E. flying under short
 sail with fine weather Lat 25 30
 29 30 South Long 17 57 So ended the

Monday July 16
 All this day a fresh breeze from
 the Eastward and rough weather
 coming from the S. L. Wright
 and a rather light fair weather
 Lat 27 36 Long 17 40 So ended the

Tuesday July the 17
 All this day a fresh breeze and
 rough weather saw the Wright to
 leave the wind E. S. E. and standing
 the flying Lib. whips So ended Lat 28 29
