Wednesday July the 18th 1866

All this day a smart breeze from the Eastward at 1 P.M. spoke with the Steamer at 2 P.M. the wind hauled to the south Lat 28, 45

Thursday July 19

All this day a fine breeze from the South and five vessels to the S and W of us among them one of the bark of oil tanker broke and among them it ship but it standing by the wind to the Eastward Lat 29, 15 Long 78, 15

Friday July 20

First part of this day began with a smart breeze from the S standing by the wind to the Eastward. Middle and later part moderate and hazy weather So ended Lat 29, 32 Long 78, 15

Saturday July 21

First part of this day a light breeze from the South standing by the wind to the Eastward saw several shoals of porpoise but at sunset took in sail for them So ended this day Lat 29, 30

Sunday July 22

All this day a fine breeze from the Westward saw many short sail at 1 P.M. spoke with a ship and that towards them but saw nothing more of them so ended this day Lat 29, 20 Long 78, 15

Monday July the 23 1866

All this day a fresh breeze from the S W saw a ship running to the S. S. So ended

Tuesday July 24

All this day a fresh breeze and hazy weather from the S W running to the S. S. at 4 P.M. spoke the Steamer Lat 30, 47 Long 78, 00

Wednesday July 25

All this day a fresh breeze and hazy weather from the S W at 10 P.M. spoke the Steamer the ship went on board and stayed till sunset So ended Lat 31, 16 Long 78, 53

Thursday July 26

First part of this day began with a squally weather from the S W at 7 P.M. saw two under reef foresail reef by and and hauled out of the Light at 10 it broke away and is on the Lat was 31, 33 Later part much the same saw one vessel So ended

Friday July 27

First part of this day it moderate down Middle part it cleared off Later part calm and saw several vessels but nothing else worth noting. Spoke with a ship at 1 P.M. Lat 31, 24 Long 78, 26 So ended
