First part of this day began
with a heavy gale and heavy squalls
middle part much the same
Later part it moderated somewhat
at 6 P.M. left of and set the
Sick with the boat out steering
South by East Lat 21, 57.3

Monday Jan the 14
First part of this day began
with a fresh gale from the S.W.
steering South turned the reef
out of the fore sail and put head
in the S.W. Middle part the wind
changed to the N.W. at 4 P.M.
set the main sail & sailed with
clear weather Sooner Lat 21, 58.3

Tuesday Jan 15
First part of this day began
with a strong breeze from the N.W.
steering South with clear
weather at dark it cleared off
Later part a fine breeze from the S.W. at
6 P.M. set the main sail turned the reef
out of the main sail and bent the
gaff top sail for a flying jib with
fine clear weather Sooner Lat 21, 59

Friday Jan 18
First part of this day a fine
breeze from the S.E. steering by the
wind to the South were still to
work on the boat Middle and later
part the wind worked around to the
S.W. Sooner Lat 21, 59 Long 61, 37

Saturday Jan the 19
First part of this day began
with light and hazy weather from
the West were steering to the S
finished the boat and put her
out on the main Middle part
calm Later part light air and
calm and a bark at
10 P.M. covered a boat and went
on board the Ship Abbie Bracket
from Lock Haven will bound to Grand
at 11 P.M. squally Sooner Lat 21, 53

Sunday Jan 20
First part of this
day began with squalls from the
S.W. at 3 P.M. it cleared off at 5 took
the store out of the fore and the Middle and
later part light squalls and the wind
changed to the S.E. Sooner Lat 20, 58
