Monday April the 29 1867

First part of this day began with a fine breeze steering S by E at midnight saw the Island of Dominica So 2 miles

Tuesday April 30
All this day light and hazy at 4 P.M. came to anchor at Pointe-a-Pitre for wood So 2 miles

Wednesday May 1 1867
All this day a light breeze and fine weather got up our wood at 8 P.M. got under weigh and went to sea very moderate steering S.W. 1/2 W

Thursday May 2
All this day beat out of the South end of Guadeloupe So 2 miles

Friday May 3
First part of this day light and moderate breeze and later part the same So 2 miles

Saturday May 4
All this day high air and calm So 2 miles

Sunday May 5
First part of this day a light breeze and squalls of rain at 3 P.M. came to anchor at St. Estienne but part raining So 2 miles

Monday May 6
All this day laying at anchor employed at various jobs So 2 miles

Tuesday May the 7 1867

All this day laying at anchor employed at various jobs about the vessel So 2 miles

Wednesday May 8
All this day laying at anchor with fine weather all hands employed So 2 miles

Thursday May 9
All this day fine weather at 10 A.M. got under weigh and went to sea at sunset the Gale of St. Marking bearing East 10 miles steering S.W. 1/2 W. Much am later part the same saw nothing So 2 miles

Friday May 10
All this day a smart breeze steering by the wind to the South saw several vessels running to leeward So 2 miles Lat 19, 25

Saturday May 11
All this day fine weather steering to the S.W. at 3 P.M. saw sharp fin black fish larvae and chased them several saw several vessels at 4 o'clock ship and steamer went ahead and the job So 2 miles Lat 20, 26

Sunday May 12
All this day a fine breeze at 8 o'clock saw black fish larvae for them but did not get any So 2 miles

Monday May 13
All this day a smart breeze steering S.W. saw nothing was they of note So 2 miles this day Lat 21 01 Long 67, 02
