We got our anchor and made in Provincetown
 Harbor at eight A.M. and stood out with a
 good sailing breeze from the W.N.W. at half past
 eleven P.M. we passed Race Point and ends the
 twenty four hours

Dec 30 Thursday Remarks of the twenty four hours.

at eight A.M. I put the log 40-10 Log 6831
 moderate wind from W.N.W. to S.W. at half past
 twelve P.M. the high land bore West three miles did
 clear weather we take our departure at 20 min of three
 A.M. light breeze bore West six miles did course
 run S.E. at four P.M. we decide our main intention
 catches last part good weather 20 ends the twenty
 four hours

Dec 31 Friday Remarks of the twenty four hours

log 40-10 Log 6833
 first part of this day weather pleasant wind from
 the N.W. and N.N.W. course started S.E. we got
 a sight at two P.M. made our log 6803
 good weather all of the last part had the wind all the
 way from S.W. to W.N.W. course from S.E. to S.W.
 we set down our anchor at eight A.M.
 and did other ship's duty all hands well
 20 ends the twenty four hours
