Jan 14 Friday Remarks of the twenty four hours

at three PM Lat 12 45 Long 60 01

a good fair sail breeze from the E. N. E. course South all hand a hard deck doing ship's duty so ends the twenty four hours

Jan 15 Saturday Remarks of the twenty four hours

at three PM Lat 12 46 Long 60 06

a fresh wind from the E. N. E. course at three PM and by 11 at eight PM put two reefs in the mainsail and took in outer gill have had it equally with same so ends the twenty four hours

Jan 16 Sunday Remarks of the twenty four hours

at three PM Lat 12 44 Long 60 16

fresh wind from the E. N. E. course first part of day we had squalls of rain, at three PM made the Island of Desada four points of our weather how we halled up by the windward S. E. by 4 at half past three we tacked ship heading N. E. until day light then tacked and stood S. E. at eight PM the S. E. end bore S. W. dist eight miles at twelve PM the Island Margarita bore S. W. dist five miles so ends the twenty four hours

Jan 17 Monday Remarks of the twenty four hours

fresh wind from the E. N. E. with squalls of rain came to anchor at Prince Rupert by afternoon PM the ship R. M. Simmons Capt. R. Cook

Master says here at anchor he and daughter and Mr. J. Pickens on board of us so ends the twenty four hours

Jan 18 Monday Remarks of the day

first part fresh wind and rain from the E. N. E. at nine PM weather better so we went to work back out our dale and filled cisterns with water and brought some fresh so ends the twenty four hours

Jan 19 Tuesday Remarks of the day

fresh breeze and rain first part last part more pleasant at hand to work a hard deck the ship Rising Sun came to anchor here at five PM so ends this day

Jan 20 Wednesday Remarks of the day

weather first part quite pleasant last part showers of rain we got our anchor at ten PM at the same time the ship Heron came to anchor we stayed at base on to put letters ashore at twelve we was passing St. Marmora so ends the day

Jan 21 Remarks of the day Thursday

at day light we was in sight of St. Vincent came to anchor at two PM so ends this day
