Sunday 24th These 24 hours commence with strong breezes from W N W heading S W with foggy weather employed in breaking out for water and sugar Middle part strong winds from S W Latter part pleasant. Course N by W Lat 58.37

Monday 25th Strong gales from N E W heading W Latter part laying to under close reefed M. Top sail Latter part wore ship heading N W Lat 58.50

Tuesday 26th Laying to wind N N W Lat 58.50

Wednesday 27th Strong gales from W S W heading N W Latter part set whole Top Sails Courses & Jib at 11 at N wore ship & double reefed Topsail

Thursday 28th Laying to under double reefed M. Topsail & Foresail Latter part wore ship to N N W & set double reefed Top Sails reefed M. mainsail and Jib Lat 58.41

Friday 29th These 24 hours commence with strong winds from W heading N N W Middle part made all sail Latter part squally Lat 49.32

Saturday 30th These 24 hours commence with strong breezes from the W heading N N W at 4 P M double reefed Topsails Middle part made all sail Latter part double reefed Topsails a ship in sight to windward boiling

Sunday 31st These 24 hours commence with strong gales from the W heading N N W with squally weather Latter part made all sail Course N by W Lat 46.30

Monday Jan 1st 49 These 24 hours commence with strong winds from S S W with pleasant weather

Thursday 4th These 24 hours commence with strong winds from the S employed in sending up Royal yards at 2 P M make the Island of St. Mary's Coast of Chile Latter part beating up to Talcahuana

Friday 5th Came to anchor in Talcahuana Latter part got off a reef of water arrived ship Talcahuana To Haven sailed Emerald. N Bedford

Saturday 6th employed in stowing down arrived ship Enterprise Wga at last

Sunday 7th worked ashore on Liberty
