Thursday 18th These 24 hours commence with light winds from S by W heading W Middle part pleasant Latter part pleasant

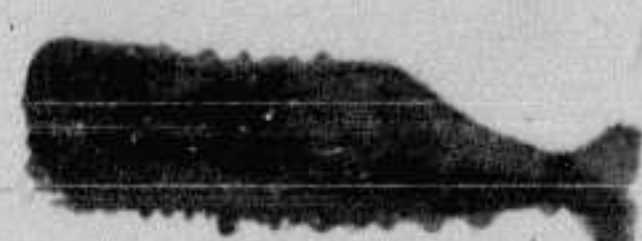

Saturday 27th These 24 hours light winds from N employed in boiling Latter part finished and washed ship & made all sail 3 ships in sight standing S by W Lat 34.09

Sunday 28th These 24 hours commence with light winds from S by W heading S by W at 5 P.M. wore ship heading E by S Latter part pleasant

Monday 29th These 24 hours commence with light winds from W to N heading at 6 P.M. shortened sail & wore ship Latter part made all sail spoke ship Navigator Salome 45 tons 2000 Lat 34.40 Long 82.44

Tuesday 30th Commences with light wind from S by W at 3 P.M. spoke Baya Saturna Stonnington at 6 P.M. Peruvian 6 tons 1200 Latter part pleasant

Wednesday 31st These 24 hours commence with strong breezes from W to S heading S by W employed in stowing down oil between decks at 4 P.M. spoke ship Emerald 16 tons 800 R. Quinan Middle part strong winds
