

Remarks on Board Ship Nauticon
Friday 29th These 24 hours commence with
moderate breezes from the W heading NW to
at 4 P M double reefed the Topsails Latter
part made all sail

Saturday 30th These 24 hours commence
with light winds from the W heading
NW to at 5 P M took in S. & Sails and
Bk. jib & tacked ship heading N. N. W.
Latter part made all sail Solgona
bearing S W by S distant 16 miles Lat 3.09

Sunday 1st These 24 hours commence
with light winds from the W with pleasant
weather employed in breaking out for
B. & M. classes at 4 P M took ship
to the N. N. W. Latter part 2 boats
ashore fishing Also saw a steamboat
steering S S W Lat 3.05

Monday July 2nd These 24 hours commence
with light airs from the W at 4 P M
The boats came aboard with some fish
& plantains Latter part pleasant Lat 3.08

Tuesday 3rd These 24 hours commence with
light winds from the W steering N by E
at 2 P M picked up an old canoe at 5
strong breezes double reefed the Topsails &
wore ship heading S S W Latter part
raining Also made all sail Lat 4.06

Wednesday 4th Light airs from the
S S W employed in breaking out for
Meat Also saw a Brig steering to the
N. E Latter part rose new boat fells Lat 5.08

Thursday 5th These 24 hours commence with
light with ~~light~~ winds from the W heading S S W
employed in breaking out & stowing off the
sail pen Latter part raining employed in
mending Main Top & Allant Sail

Friday 6th These 24 hours commence with
light winds from the W heading S S W &
employed in tending M. P. S. Sail Midea
part wore ship to the S W Latter part raining

Saturday 7th These 24 hours commence with
light winds from the N E steering S E at
4 P M wind from the S S E heading S E
Latter part pleasant Lat 4.51

Sunday 8th These 24 hours commence with
light winds from the W N W heading
S E & employed in breaking out for Bread
Latter part raining Lat 4.36

Monday 9th These 24 hours commence with
light airs from the S W heading W N W
Latter part pleasant Lat 4.04

Tuesday 10th These 24 hours commence with
light winds from the S W heading S S W
At 4 P M tacked to the W N W at 7
double reefed Top Sails Latter part raining
made sail & tacked to the S.

Wednesday 11th These 24 hours commence
with light winds from the W N W heading
S At 6 P M double reefed the Topsails
Middle part raining Latter part wore to the W
& made all sail Lat 3.26
