Saturday 9th Light winds & pleasant weather
 Wind N.E. employed in painting Bow Boat.
 L att 4.04 at 7 P.M. double reefed the Top sails
 Courses & took in Jib & courses L after part made
 & S M sail & employed in breasting
 out for & setting up shooks

Sunday 10th Moderate winds & pleasant
 Wind N.E. employed in setting up shooks at
 4 P.M. double reefed L after part
 made all sail & made Dean's B
 at 10 A.M. sent 2 boats ashore trading

Monday 11th Laying off & on at 6 P.M. took
 in sail steering to the S.E.
 L after part made Maria having
 distant 25 miles

Tuesday 12th Laying off & on trading for logs
 Course S.E. & employed in setting up shooks
 L att 16.33 & breaking out for water
 Wind N.E.

Wednesday 13th Light winds & pleasant
 Wind S.E. employed in setting up shooks
 Course S. L after part made Otahite
 L att 17.17 bearing S to distant 45 miles

Thursday 14th getting ready for port
 Wind N. L after part washing ship

Friday 15th Strong breezes & cloudy
 Wind N.W. employed in washing ship
 L att 17.30 L after part hove too heading W

Saturday 16th Hove too at 6 P.M. were to
 the N.E. L after part stood
 " S.E. till 10 A.M. then came
 too & took in Bow Sail &
 M in Top sail heading to N.E.

Sunday 17th Strong gales & squally at 2 P.M.
 set double reefed Top sails & Jib
 Wind N at 6 P.M. took in B & M in Top sails
 L att 17.43 & Jib L after part moderate set double
 reefed Top sails Jib & courses

Monday 18th Strong breezes & squally L after
 part made all sail & stood for
 the land

Tuesday 19th at 8 P.M. anchored in Otahite
 L after part getting off & stowing
 down water & painting ship

Wednesday 20th Getting off & stowing down water
 & painting ship arrived at large town &
 whaler of Boston

Thursday 21st getting off & stowing down
 water sailed French ship M. west for
 Oparaiso I wish I was in her

Friday 22nd Watch ashore on Liberty

Saturday 23rd " " " & employ
 in painting ship

Sunday 24th Monday 25th Tuesdays
