

Wednesday the 4th March 1835

Light N.E. winds steering N.W. by E. cleared the S. Side the lands & laid over oil between decks fitting rigging
Lat 13° 06' 20" 02
Lon 157° 06' 73" 28 West

Thursday the 5th March

This day light airs and calm saw one piece of squid broke out the main hatchway to trim ship all engaged in fitting and tarring rigging
Lat 13° 06' 19" 22 S

Friday the 6th March

This day calm & swell from the North all engaged in fitting tarring rigging
Lon 157° 06' 72" 42 45 W.
Lat 13° 06' 19" 02 S

Saturday the 7th March

Light airs and calm saw porpoises Grampuses little sunfish all engaged in fitting and tarring rigging
Lat 13° 06' 18" 32 S

Sunday the 8th March

Light airs and calm saw the land saw many small fish and porpoises
Lat 13° 06' 17" 18 S

Monday the 9th March 1835.

Light airs and calm saw Grampuses, porpoises finbacks & small fish all variously engaged 50 miles from land & running along shore
Lat 13° 06' 16" 57 South

Tuesday the 10th March

This day light wind & running 40 or 50 miles from land saw porpoises, finbacks, blackfish & hump the
Lat 13° 06' 15" 59 South

Wednesday the 11th March 1835.

This day light breezes at 12 noon 20 miles from land kept off W. & N. saw humpbacks porpoises washed the ship round
Lat 13° 06' 14" 39 South

Thursday the 12th March 1835.

This day all of the whale kind except the spermability all variously engaged with a vigilant look out at the mast head
Coarse W. & N. W. Lat 13° 06' 13" 50 South

Friday the 13th March 1835.

These 24 hours light breezes from E. & S. steering N. & W. at 12 noon 20 miles West at 6 P.M. by the wind S. & S. W. at 6 A.M. tacked to the N. & S. saw blackfish porpoises
Lat 13° 06' 13" 10 South

Saturday the 14th March

Standing to the South and N. & S. saw blackfish porpoises
No Obs this day

Sunday the 15th March

These 24 hours standing to the E. & S. and E. saw many blackfish and porpoises, and some few finbacks, No sperm whales in these waters
Lat 13° 06' 12" 41 South

Monday the 16th March

Light airs and calm standing in shore at daylight saw the Is. of Lorenzo bearing N. by E. 25 miles
Lat 13° 06' 12" 22 South

Tuesday the 17th March

Light airs and calm at 12 noon 20 miles from land saw anchor in 5 fathoms water & anchor found the Camaster was boarded by capt. Pitt
Ends Pine Harbour.
