Thursday the 23rd April
These 24 hours fine Easterly breezes & breeze
to the S.W. and South saw Shells on the
water pieces of Squid. (Saw as I sail to
the North End no whales

Friday the 26th April. 1895.

saw nothing. Lat 34° 45' N. Long 108° 48' West.
