

Tuesday the 26th May 1825.

These 24 hours fine breezes from the East steering S.W. saw a bone shark. Some diamonds fish where is the whale no one knows Saw a few birds & ibies and others  
Low Day Chrono at 144° 58' 45" West.

Lat Day Obs 50° 01' South

Wednesday the 27th May

This day as usual saw nothing new. I shall believe Wind E by S. steering S by W. I discharged the 13 rats & lobsters  
Low Day Chrono 146° 25' West

Lat Day Obs 60° 48' South

Thursday the 28th May

These 24 hours fine easterly breezes. Steering S by W. Saw a few birds but 35 lbs oil in between decks quite tired. Seeing it on Deck  
Low Day Chrono 147° 26' 45" West

Lat Day Obs 90° 22' S.

Friday the 29th May

These 24 hours fine breezes from the N.W. steering to the South. A current to the Westward about 30 miles per day. Saw nothing at all this day had a few squalls of rain. Winds as all other days with no whales  
Low Day Chrono 147° 56' 45" West

Saturday the 30th May 1825

Fine weather with light breezes from the North steering to the South a swell from the S.W. a current running to the Westward  
Low Day Chrono 148° 04' 45"

Sunday the 31st May 1825

Light air and calm with squalls of rain  
Saw nothing  
Low Day Chrono 148° 47' West

Monday the 1st June

These 24 hours first part calm with rain middle and latter fresh breezes from the S. to S.E. Saw a few birds  
Low Day Chrono 148° 47' West

Lat Day Obs 13° 54' South

Tuesday the 2nd June

These 24 hours fresh E by S. and S.E. by E. breeze standing to the Southward 5 hours to the N.E. at P.M. Saw large of oil bearing. It did 15 miles, passed it 10 miles off. Fresh breezes with a bad lead sea  
Low Day Chrono at 2h 25m P.M. 149° 03' West

Lat Day Obs 15° 04' S.

Wednesday the 3rd June

These 24 hours strong breezes with squalls steering to the S. Wind E by S. five hours to the N.E. Close reef top sails. Jib main sail hoisted  
Low Day Chrono 149° 15' West

Lat Day Obs 16° 24' South

Thursday the 4th June

Fresh winds with squalls at 9. Saw the land down of Town van here to took a pilot at 2 P.M. Came to in Tahiti in 13 fathoms water. Observed the ship round found the ship Envooy of whose island a covering oil about on these Tahiti has not altered much as to appearance. Since last here and none in journals. at least I can hardly see any difference. Ends this time in I see to all intents and purposes.
