

Sunday the 16th Aug 1835

These 24 hours fresh breezes starting off at 6 A.M. a beating to the Windward engaged in repair Canoe on board with a few coconuts. Lateral Main topsail. Making Casks for Oil. saw 10 Standing to the North patches of land in clearing birds & small fish. Ends Squally with a weather I judge seen 20 miles from the vessel. C.D.C. saw. Lat By Ob 11° 59' South Lead the Natives entirely naked not having any Bay Cloth. 175° 54' East

Monday the 17th Aug

These 24 hours first part light breezes at 8 A.M. double and close reef Jib & Spanker. Main sail. M. San Blas Is. ran a long under the lee of it had a canoe came off with 3 natives but could not find it. Saw many dolphins sporting about the ship to appearance having fine times among the flying fish which are very numerous. Ends. No Bl. San Blas Is. seen Lat By Ob 2° 05' South Lon at 9 A.M. 175° 56' East

Tuesday the 18th Aug

Fine weather at 6 A.M. Saw Morias Is. ran a long under the lee of it the lee side the Is. lying N.W. about 35 or 40 miles long with several good reefs off from 3 to 6 miles with a good deal of shoal ground. Saw several canoes some of them very long at 6 P.M. have a Coast 4 miles off the land the North point bearing North. Lat By Ob 11° 34' South

Wednesday the 19th Aug

These 24 hours at daylight saw a large whale put off took him to the ship but him in commenced hauling. Saw the land 15 miles off. Saw many blackfish and porpoises. Ends a fine fish Morias Is. North W. Point N. 61° 15' miles off

Saturday the 3rd Oct 1835

These 24 hours commenced with fresh breezes Wind from E. a beating to the Windward engaged in repair Main topsail. Making Casks for Oil. saw small fish. Ends Squally with a weather. Lat By Ob 11° 59' South

Sunday the 4th Oct

This day Squally with a lead sea Wind from E. to N.E. a working to the Eastward under double and close reef Jib & Spanker. Main sail. Saw a break off the lee bow ran for it but could not find it. Saw many dolphins sporting about the ship to appearance having fine times among the flying fish which are very numerous. Ends. No Bl. San Blas Is. seen

Monday the 5th Oct

These 24 hours strong breezes with heavy squalls from the E.S.E. a working to the Eastward. saw a sperm whale under our lee but cannot do any thing with him. thick Squally weather under close reef Main topsail & Mizzen foresail. I am Observed

Tuesday the 6th Oct

This day a little better. At double reef topsails Jib & Spanker. latter hauled. Spanker Main sail. Squally with a lead sea. Lat By Ob 11° 34' South

Wednesday the 7th Oct

These 24 hours Squally with rain. Saw many olive coars and ship Jacks. Lat By Ob 11° 34' South

Thursday the 8th Oct

This day first part clear engaged in repair. Ends Squally. Lat By Ob 11° 59' S.
