

Wednesday the 21st Oct 1835.

These 24 hours commenced with fine breezes from the N.W. steering N.E. By D. at 4 A.M. wind hauled to the N.E. leading to the East. at 6 P.M. and 4 to the N.E. Saw many small fish. took N.W. with fresh breezes under double reefed topsails. Jib. Spanker. Mainsail hauled. Saw many birds manowar hawks and others. Ends. Spent at 4 P.M. per Chron. 174° 51' 15" East

Lat By Obs 18° 40' South

Thursday the 22nd Oct

These 24 hours commenced with fine weather Wind N.E. By D. heading 12 hours N.W. By D. and 12 E. By D. and 12 By W. Saw porpoises. middle. Staked a fore. Saw many small fish. birds in abundance middle. topsail repairing Breakers. Saw many bright eyes. Staked a main topsail. Repaired on old jib. Saw the water. Ends all ready for fish. Ends squally. Lat By Obs 18° 51' South

Friday the 23rd Oct 1835

These 24 hours fine weather wind N.W. to the N.E. & East, saw many birds, took 30 lbs of 2. visions from the after hole put it in the fore peak. Repairing Breakers. Ends with fine clear weather. Lat By Obs 19° 20' South. Saw Bay Chron 175° 01' East at 4 P.M.

Saturday the 24th Oct 1835.

These 24 hours fine weather 6 hours to the E. 18 to the Southward. Saw fish. Birds. repaired a fore main. Spanker on cent. repaired and lent the mizzen top. G. sail. Lent an other fore sail. Ends this day. Lat By Obs 19° 49' South. Saw Bay Chron 175° 23' 15" E. Chron. 174° 52' 45" at 4 P.M. per compass

Sunday the 25th Oct 1835

Light E.D.E. Breezes with fine weather 4 hours to the N.E. 20 to the Southward saw a few birds a bad swell from the East. mostened for whales. Lat By Obs 20° 44' South

Monday the 26th Oct.

These 24 hours fine weather wind light from N.W. to N.E. heading 20 hours to the South. Saw many small fish. a few birds, engaged in steering middle. Staked a foresail on cent the fore topsail lent an other repairing Breakers. Ends. Lat By Obs 175° 14' 45" East at 3 h 30 m P.M.

Lat By Obs 21° 19' South

Tuesday the 27th Oct 1835.

These 24 hours light air and calm heading to the N.W. By D. and 12 By W. Saw porpoises. middle. Staked a fore. topsail repairing Breakers. Saw many bright eyes. Saw the water. Ends all ready for fish. Lat By Obs 174° 47' 30" East at 3 h 30 m P.M. Chron. 174° 15' 15" East. Lat By Obs 21° 51' South

Wednesday the 28th Oct

This day light air and calm heading to the South and N.W. By D. at 6 P.M. Saw a small sand. Repairing N.W. 12 miles with a reef all around it. Lat of the middle 173° 40' 173° 50' Lat 21° 50' South. a strong current setting to the N.W. repaired the Spanker. Saw many birds. small fish. Lat By Obs 22° 00' South.

Thursday the 29 Oct

These 24 hours fine weather Saw many manowar hawks, and other birds fish. Grampuses. Latter part Wind W. to N.W. By D. steering N.E. Lat By Obs 174° 31' E Chron 174° 15" E. Lat By Obs 22° 31' South

Friday the 30th Oct 1835.

These 24 hours fine weather Wind N.W. steering N.E. Saw 1 finback. Painted the Ships of the Lark. Saw many sea birds. fish. W. Ends. Lat By Obs 24° 16' South
