

Saturday the 31<sup>st</sup> Oct 1835.

These 24 hours fine weather Wind from S.W. to N.W. Steering S.E. per Compass painted the Starboard Side of the Ship and Sailing by Chrono 177° 13' 45" East at 4<sup>h</sup> 30<sup>m</sup> P.M. Lat by Obs 25° 39' South

Sunday the 1<sup>st</sup> November 1835.

These 24 hours light winds with pleasant Wind from South West to N.W. Steering S.E. per compass saw a fine birds Ends. Lat by Obs 27° 17' South

Monday the 2<sup>d</sup> Nov

These 24 hours light airs and calm with a bad smell from the N.W. wind N.W. Saw several finbacks, killers, small fish, engaged in painting water ways, Comings, &c. Ends this day. Lat by Obs 28° 02' South

Tuesday the 3<sup>rd</sup> Nov 1835.

These 24 hours fine breezes from the North. Steering to the S.E. at 9 A.M. spoke the Ship Braganza of New Bedford 17<sup>m</sup> 700 lbs Oil at 2 P.M. saw Sunday Isd bearing S.P.E. 10 miles thick with rain Ends

Wednesday the 4<sup>th</sup> Nov

This day ran down west on shore a fine Land Beach to land upon on the S.W. Side of water and wood to be obtained Company Braganza stood off S. of P.A.S. Ends

Thursday the 5<sup>th</sup> Nov

These 24 hours fresh breeze from N.W. with squalls at 9 A.M. saw one of the Curlew Isd bearing N.W. by S 25<sup>m</sup> Ends

Friday the 6<sup>th</sup> Nov 1835

These 24 hours fine breezes from the N.W. by W heading to the S.E. at 12 noon passed a Barque at 4 a brig Braganza in sight saw a sail to windward. Saw Gumpens Lat by Obs 31° 04' South

Saturday the 7<sup>th</sup> Nov

These 24 hours fine weather painted parts the S. side saw a brig to the North. Wind N.W. heading to the N.E. by N. and N.W. Braganza in company variously engaged. Saw small fish and birds. Lat by Chrono 177° 45' 45" West at 4<sup>h</sup> 30<sup>m</sup> P.M. Lat by Obs 31° 20' South

Sunday the 8<sup>th</sup> Nov

These 24 hours fine weather Wind North heading to the N.W. Braganza in sight saw porpoises and ends, a small beach ends a looking sharp for a whale but cannot see him Hope my boys. Lat by Chrono 177° 55' 4" West at 4<sup>h</sup> P.M. Lat by Obs 30° 56' South

Monday the 9<sup>th</sup> Nov

Tuesday begins with fine breezes from the N.W. steering to the N.W. and N.E. spoke the Clermont & Richmonds of Newport, 22<sup>m</sup> 1150 lbs oil. Rose off Halifax 25<sup>m</sup> 1200 lbs O.C. saw nothing what kind Lat by Obs 29° 04' South

Tuesday the 10<sup>th</sup> Nov

Saw nothing of the whale kind looks yesterday

Wednesday the 11<sup>th</sup>

These 24 hours fine weather witnessed the open seas shipped a new tiller that, Braganza in sight saw a to the Eastward heading to the South. Ends Lat by Obs 27° 50' South Lat by Chrono 177° 41' West. P.M. Chrono
