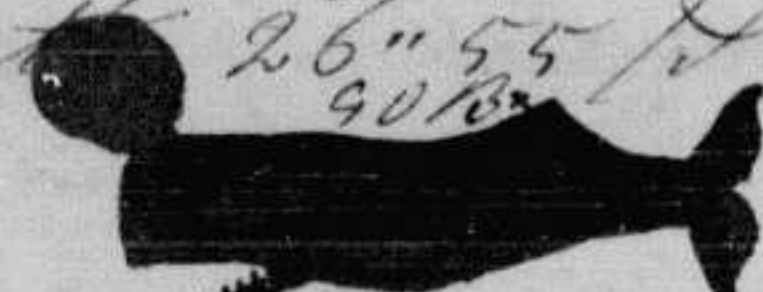


Monday the 18th Jan. 1836

These 24 hours fresh breezes with squalls at 7
4 M. Saw 2 whales put off to sea took one
to the ship cut in the body a head. Saw
whales heading S.W. Lat 26° 55' South
Lon 173° 56' West.



Tuesday the 19th Jan

These 24 hours fine weather here in the head
sail for an other fish all hands engaged in
cutting up and boiling out the whale. Cans
Lat 26° 54' South

Wednesday the 20th Jan

These 24 hours commenced with fine weather
Wind East leading to the S.E. at 10 M. moved
on fresh breezes with squalls landed the
fore and mizzen topsails. Secured
oil on deck finished sailing

Lat 26° 56' South

Thursday the 21st Jan

This day fresh breezes with a bad sea caused
the forecast set him out. Soon landed it
again filled and coopered 25 casks ready
for stowing. Some oil casks coopered. Wind
East leading S.E. Saw many birds etc.

Lat 27° 26' South

Friday the 22nd Jan

Fresh breezes with a bad sea broke out the
hold & stowed down 90 lbs oil fuel between the fore
and main hatchways. Wind E.S.E. leading to the
South

Lat 27° 30' South

Saturday the 23rd Jan

Fresh winds with a bad sea stoad off the
ten hold cleared the ship wind E.S.E. lead
Lon 174° 29' 30" W. Lat 27° 51' S.

Sunday the 24th Jan 1836

These 24 hours fresh breezes from the S.E. head
ing to the E.S.E. and S.E. with a bad head
sea. Saw many birds several sharks.
Lon 176° 48' 30" West.

Lat 27° 19' South

Monday the 25th Jan

These 24 hours fresh breezes with calm. Squalls etc.
Broke out the run & stoad some cargo away
Set up 6 pipes. Hooks for bread Wind S.W. E.
heading E by N, and East. Cans.

Lat 26° 51' South

Tuesday the 26th Jan

These 24 hours fresh breezes heading to the South
Wind E.S.E. Started 9 short cask bread into pipes
1 of 1/2 hook-heads, 1 of 1/2 sails, 1 of corn, one of 1/2
etc. etc. Saw a large break or was reported
Cans this day

Lat 27° 07' South

Wednesday the 27th Jan

These 24 hours fine weather with the exception
of a few small rain squalls. Saw jumpers, &
blackfish, repairing cask, started the last
cask of 1/2 sails, and fitted try gear try works etc.

Lat 27° 10' South

Thursday the 28th Jan

These 24 hours fine weather fitting all cask
etc. Saw porpoises, Birds in abundance, Cans.

Lat 27° 09' South

Friday the 29th Jan 1836

These 24 hours fine weather with a light wind
from E.S.E. leading to the North at 3 P.M.
Spoke the American 20 M. 500 lbs oil & cutting
a large whale. Saw an other sail to the S.W.
Saw blackfish.
