These 24 hours fine weather took in the
head made sail heading to the South
at 4 P.M. Saw a shoal of whales going
N.W. could not get one for the want

These 24 hours fine breezes finished boiling Saw Jumper, Grampuses, Porpoises, latter part fresh breezes from S. E. leading to the E. N. E. & on this day.

These 24 hours Fog and rain & squalls wind
W.S.E. here and hereabout Lat 2

up on the upper chains I was rugged
