it Started 5 large cask and I hooked them not

gills mainsail bled reefed & topsail hauled
down and mizzzen topsails wind East and
E. S. E. Lead Northward Oh soon had near

Freesh breezes with squalls. Brought out the app
hold for provision. wind E & E. Leading N & and
N & E, at 4 P. M. more to the South. under close
Keeps Ends. Leath Bay Oct 29 56 Seal

Tuesday the 22nd March 1836

These 24 hours fresh Breezes from the East Head
N.E., Saw a small break, making breakers
filled 13 with cold oil rised up on old pile
Low By Ob 173° 30 West at 3 P.M.

Wednesday the 23rd March

These 24 hours fresh E By N. and E N E. Breezes
had S E. and N E By S. engaged in making
beakers and other jobs to numerous to mention
or rather of to little consequence, as every day
recurrences winds. Lat By Cb 33° 04' South

Thursday the 24th March

This day fresh Gail with rain Wind ESE.
Lead S.E. landed fonesail Blast up Main
uprail took in bow & mast Boats took up
the quarter Boats. Sun obscured.

Friday the 25th March

These 24 hours Strong Gales with Squalls wind
E By N, and E N E, head S E, rain. rain. O! what
weather, almost ready to give up will soon if we
don't have a change of wind and weather
No Ob. Sun Obscured

Saturday the 26th March

This day more moderate made Sail repairing
rain top G. Sail making Breathers Pan pieces
of S. S. & heavy E. N. E. S. S. wind East
and E. N. E. Lead to the Southward
Long by Ob. at 17^h 40^m West at 4^h 20^m P. M.

Sunday the 27th March

This Day fine weather Wind N. N. W. & Steering
