

Sunday the 9th Oct 1836.

These 24 hours fine breezes from the S.W. round to North. Steering S by E. Saw many porpoises, and birds. Lat by Obs 32° 56' N

Monday the 10th Oct 1836

These 24 hours fine breezes from N.W. to N.E. Steering to the East at 5 P.M. Saw a sail on point on the S. Bow repairing Breakers, Saw porpoises, Lat by Obs 31° 59' North

Tuesday the 11th Oct.

These 24 hours fine weather with fresh North wind. Steering S by E. few Comps. making Breakers. Obs. a heavy S.W. gale many large birds. Lat by Obs 31° 31' North

Wednesday the 12th Oct

This day wind hauled to the N.W. Steering S by E few Comps. Saw birds. Engaged in fitting rigging Cooper made eight Breakers this day. Lat by Obs 30° 05' N

Thursday the 13th Oct

This day fresh N.W. and N.E. winds with light rain. Steering S by E few Comps. making Breakers. repaired the Spanker. hoisted the Quate on the upper Cross. Lat at 2 P.M. 163° 30' 15 West. Lat by Obs 29° 43' N.

Friday the 14th Oct

These 24 hours fresh breezes from the S.W. First part. Middle hauled to the N.W. with rain latter to the N.E. with a bad sea Engaged in fitting rigging. Lat by Obs 160° 04' West. Lat by Obs 159° 46' 15 West. Lat by Obs 28° 05' N.

Saturday the 15th Oct 1836.

This day fresh N.W. and N.E. winds. Steering S by E few Comps. Saw many large birds among the rest an Emel. Birds. Lat by Obs 27° 30' North

Sunday the 16th Oct.

This day heavy Comers and continues with fresh N.W. to N.E. winds. Steering S by E to South. Saw a few birds, we have been in great hopes of seeing a whale but begin to despair. Wind with a West wind making a South Cross being in sea by calculation from last day of the East. End of moon. Lat by Obs 25° 20' N

Monday the 17th Oct

These 24 hours fine westerly winds. Steering South. Saw porpoises. brook out the after hold for Coom, Tops, H. Cooper making Breakers, new main topsail braces, fore topsail clewlines, brook the braces. Wind this 24 hours. Lat by Obs 155° 51' 45 West at 4 P.M. Lat by Obs 23° 47' North

Tuesday the 18th Oct.

This day light variable winds mostly from the North at 2 P.M. Saw a Sail West at 4 P.M. Saw moon - bearing South. Wind a running in for the thick with rain all the fore part of the day. Lat by Obs 20° 05' N

Wednesday the 19th Oct 1836

This day fine breezes running in for moon at 6 P.M. at 9 the Spanker in 20 fathoms water Calm. about 2 miles below the town. Wind. So far toward moon.
