

Thursday the 17th May 1838

These 24 hours fine breezes from the P.P. steering N.W. with a tremendous North swell pointed the waterways aft & the net holds saw a Sail by the wind to the S.E. Saw much mud broke out forward took up a Sixth Moleasses. 13 of 4 Boat Ends
Long By Obs 61°47 West. Lat By Obs 27°38 North

Friday the 18th May

These 24 hours commenced with fresh South winds steering N.W. per compass at 10 northerly wind hauled to the West heading to the N.W. with rain squalls & had sea saw much mud all variously engaged. the first time that the ship has been off her course for some time

Saturday the 19th May

These 24 hours commenced calm with light rain squalls at 10 cleared with a light S.W. breeze steering to the N.W. commenced fainting out side pointed the length of a stage on the came up squalls water flying ab. Ends this day

Sunday the 20th May

This day commenced with P.W. wind with rain at 2 P.M. hauled to the N.E. Saw a large brig to the South standing S.E. made ahead up with the shift of wind a had N.W. swell. Ends
Long By Chron 66°07 West at 4 P.M.
Lat By Obs 31°45 North

Monday the 21st May 1838

These 24 hours light variable breezes from N.E. to S.E. steering N.W. Sighted ship out side. Saw a brig passed across our bows about 1/2 mile off a french man I believe something of a North swell. Ends
Long By Chron 67°10 West at 4 P.M.
Lat By Obs 32°21 North

Tuesday the 22nd May

Light N.E. wind steering N.W. Saw one brig standing to the N.E. Ends this day
Long By Chronometer 67°44'30 West
Lat By Obs 33°00 N.

Wednesday the 23rd May

Fine S.E. breezes steering N.W. at 10 noon exchanged signals with a sloop bound Southward at 3 P.M. sent a boat to the Ann morish an Italian brig from Palermo bound New York procured a box of oranges, one of lemons, a bag of rice gave him some beef & bread in exchange
Saw 5. Sail through the day
Long By Obs 69°05 at 2.30 P.M.
Lat By Obs 34°19 North

Thursday the 24th May

Fine South breezes. steering N.W. by N. at 2 A.M. Entered the stream at 5 came out of it being Lat 56°56. a tremendous sea in the Gulf. & like a mill pond in the P.P. rainy wind hauled to the S.E. of S.E. with hard rain have the try works over board, the Gulf stream is to far to the North on my chart by 60 Miles. Long By Obs 70°29 W. at 8 A.M.
