

Friday the 28th May 1836
These 24 hours Calm with light variable
winds with hard rain at 9. Cleared
up with a fine S.W. Wind. Steering N by W
Scraped the Deck & sent up 2000 yards
and sail. Ends this day with
a fine breeze & men a little tired
with the Hurry I believe

Saw by Chronometer 11^h 45 at 3^h 30 M

Sun Observed no obs -

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Saturday the 29th May
This day fine breeze from S.W. Steering
N by W. at 11 A.M. Saw Long Island near
in kept off port Gayhead at 8 P.M. Montserrat
Joint light bearing N.W. 10 or 12 miles or
brig a lead saw a top sail yard arm Schooner's
Bray fishermen at 8 P.M. Saw blocks of a
narrowing down for it and etc.
made the land off Southampton

Lat 12^h 40' 34" North

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Sunday the 30th May
Arrived at 4 P.M. in the Harbour
run the ships on the pier in
the mud and left her
