

May 6th 1841

Saturday, 6th This morn our Stewards was discharged, and we shall be obliged to have him in the Hospital not able to go home yet. Mr Brightman our Second Cook, called this morn. I like his appearance very much and hope we may not be obliged to change again this voyage. Lady Ross sent me a Request this morn, and we were all invited there to pass the afternoon but the day is so very warm and we are all feeling weary from yesterday's journey so have all been obliged to decline the invitation. This morn I fitted a waist lining for Miss Carroll. Since then have sketched the seams of a waist for Miss Annette Carroll. It is now nearly dinner time, after dinner we are going out to walk, call and do a little shopping 10 P.M.

Called at Mrs. Cook's had a very pleasant call. Mrs. Peoly has joined the evening here.

Sunday 7th This morn Dr Fowler came in to vaccinate Mrs Davis' baby and we had Chetlin vaccinated. Geo, Scutlin, Emma & I. This morning went to the Chapel heard Mr. Cathe preach from 1st Peter, 3rd 1st. Tonight I have such a bad headache do not feel able to go out. The Robert Morrison, has returned to home sick. Men that deserted themselves on board. Several of Capt Davis' men have run away. he has lost eight since coming in to Port. They expect to leave tomorrow. We shall go tomorrow if possible.

Monday 8th This morn Mrs. Puettger and I went out shopping called on Mrs Spragg. Capt Davis and family went on board tonight. do not expect to sail until tomorrow. Geo Scutlin and I went down to the wharf in p.m. with them, we intended to go to the Chapel with prayer meeting this eve, but felt too tired. Geo Miss Jamieson my Chapel Melodist to keep until our return next Sept or October.

May 11th 1841

Tuesday 9th This morn went out to do a few errands that I forgot yesterday. We expected to get out before dinner but could not, as there was too much wind. The Duke, Monday, as it is about 10 m. Capt Peoly called to see me came in with Geo. He seemed delighted to meet us. But very early we were to leave today he had 950 Pills & given all told. We started from the Consulate at 10 o'clock. here stopped a great many times to bid people goodbye. Mrs Peoly gave us a large package of Lard paper. The American Consul, Mrs. Kuper sent me a request. She with her sister called to see us yesterday. brought us (Mrs Davis and I) such a bag of fruit. Emma and Loretta each a piece of fruit cake, & the Peoly 4 eggs. Mrs Puettger came down to the ferry with us. On coming away we saw Mrs. Peoly 10th. Mrs. Peoly 10th, Katie 2nd, Michael 1st. Geo has given Robert and Emma considerable at different times. The Peoly was under me as when we got on board. I have been trying to get some of my things put back when they belong but feel so tired have not been able to do much.

Wednesday 10th Have had a beautiful day. With little wind. Sat. 15.22 St Helena is still in sight but a long distance from us. It has taken me nearly all day to put up things when they belong. have done on other week today yet feel quite tired.

Thursday 11th A pleasant day with little wind. Nothing in sight have covered the Sofa, and cut a frock for Geo.

Friday 12th Have been making Geo's frock have finished it with the exception of four button holes and the buttons. It has been nearly calm all day.

Sat. 13th Have had a little more wind today. I have finished Geo's frock and made two pairs shirts for Geo. Inside washing 11 pairs stockings for Geo and my self.
