Holmes still continues quite sick. Dr Gault
says his abscess is brought on by his own
immoderation. Lillie was vaccinated again today.

Sun 16th This morn we went to Baptist chapel
heard Mr Cotton preach from John 14th 15th
Peace I have with you. My peace I give unto you.
We have almost every with toothache. He went
out of meeting and when I returned found
he had put his tooth extractor. This eve
Capt Robbins & Davis went also with us
to the chapel again. Heard Mr Cotton preach
from Mt John 14th 15th East Peace. Said Dr Hout
of French Church his son because the fever at his
last Davis was unable to go out this eve
his lady has been vaccinated, and is quite
well. Emma & Lillie have been vaccinated for
the third time and I hope this will be
sufficient. The Presby collect this afternoon

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Monday 18th Commenced packing up all the morn
A few eyes are better but not well. he
is not yet getting on his feet. I wrote a green
sheet for him this morn. This eve the

from his horse and hurt both bones of
the left arm broken, a little above the
joint. It seems almost a miracle that

his arm but it is still paining him
quite badly. For morn I am so sorry for
him. I hope there will be no more future
expeditions to the country while I am here
but seems always to be some accident
but we ought to be very thankful that
