

the boat before the mast came below and down
and went back on deck and up again straight
the boat was a little more so. The boat was
in sight the Sabellite was some distance ahead
this morning. But we have gained on her, a big
jacket near us this morning as the other boat
beating to weather. We could not see her name
yacht? but she was not a yacht. I have written a
letter to Mr. Macdonald.

Monday 8th Have had a fair wind since last night and
are getting along nicely. There is a breeze, sea so
we are rolling about considerably. This afternoon
Lat 56.56, Long 46.56 a very heavy squall, but fortunately we were
Lat 57.46, Long 46.56 was done to us. all hands were called to take
in sail. Geo says he expected we should have
some of the squall, but our kind having rather
has kept us safe and suffers not the least
or waves to harm us. I have mended two
for stockings and a shirt and put buttons on
and buttons to the jacket.

Tuesday 9th Have had a squall day but a fair wind. We
are getting along nicely. The Sabellite and two other
sails are still in sight I have been bounding on
the water.

Wednesday 10th Have still a fair wind. and feel very thankful
for such a quick and favorable passage around
the Horn. It is very seldom that a ship is so

Lat 57.40, Long 46.56 highly favored. I have finished the suit, and
Lat 57.38, Long 46.56 feel very much pleased with it. The suit had the
best of the last night. I was up with him a long
time, and I got cold. Here had the accommodation
in my limbs today. We have lost sight of the
sails, but run more truly when they were lost
than they were beating along the coast. Geo says
does not want to get too near the land the
winds are more favorable when we are out
we shall be in good sight of the land
in a few days more if we have a good
breeze.

Thursday 11th Have had a rough day with much wind. Saw
two sails this morning one a large ship passed
just ahead of us. Passenger vessel, double top-
sails, and topgallant sails, jib and fly jib.
We had shrouble reefed topsails and were
pitching about dreadfully. George says he never
saw so much sail on a ship in such
weather. They were beating directly in to
the land. Geo says they must either have
been driven or caught on board. I have not
known the name of a white sail of the ship
and just now turning on it. The rest
of the day have been trying to make the
sail as it has been so long for him to be on
deck this afternoon.

Friday 12th Have still a fair wind a very heavy swell
and squall. We are rolling about badly
now. I have cut and made a dress waist for myself
and mended a dress and shirt for my wife.

Saturday 13th Have had very rough weather for several
a week yesterday and today have been very
very rough. The wind is directly ahead
and a strong current against us so we
are not getting along much. it is so rough
Lat 57.14, Long 46.56 cannot see sail. The ship is six years old
Lat 57.5 today and his father gave him a knife and
a belt and coat from I gave him a bag of coffee
I made for him because he has been very happy
has been what it is most all day I have
been mending and making patches for
my work.

Sunday 14th Have had very bad weather all the week
but it is improving now and we hope for
Lat 57.48, Long 46.56 better weather tomorrow. I have had an attack
Lat 58.00, Long 46.56 of neuralgia, and in trying to take care of
my back one day fell down and hurt my right
hand so it is still quite troublesome. I have
been making a pair of slippers commenced making.
have nearly finished one. have seen one sail
and one ship since Monday.
