Sunday 14th Have had a very warm day this morn. Geo. Little

Inbraska, that Ezekiel 33:6, P.C. But his silver and
I remain at the Hutchinsons house. This eve went to
the Rock Street where he heard the same man
preach from John 14:21, P.C. Sir he would say Jesus
he was an excellent speaker and I listened
with great attention to the words of truth he
fell from his lips.

Monday 15th The steamer has not yet arrived and serious
fears are entertained. The Nebraska is discharging
freight she has taken for Australia and will
leave for San Francisco tomorrow at the same
place. The steamer arrives before that time.
I have just written a long letter to Thomas
have two letters to send of this mail.

Tuesday 16th The Nebraska left this morn at two.
The hotel is left very quiet. I sent my
letters to her. This afternoon have been down
street with Geo. bought a pair of boots for
myself.

Wednesday 17th The steamer Mahoning and the packet
I.C. Murray arrived at four P.M. The
steamer broke down the second day out
and had to put back for repairs and
was detained seven days. The Queller
came by steamer, also Capt. Hazen. I like the
appearance of Mr. Queller very much. He brought
the letters for Geo. from the owner. I rec'd
one from the Mail tonight but hope to get
from Emerson it has from Sister. He is
dinner with us. The hotel is full again
with passengers for Australia. We have had
back to the room we had first left. again
and are very glad to be here. Little I have
written to the other. My Oagan was brought on shore today.

April 18th

Thursday 18th Rec'd a letter from Mrs. Maybury, one from Caroline
one from Charles. Pigeon. Geo. had another from
the owner. The Brightman seems inclined to
make trouble about his discharge, so George
cannot get the ship out today, and as tomorrow
is Sunday he is unwilling to sail on such an
unlucky day. He will go out Saturday. I have said
I was going with him. Capt. Hazen called today
and talked with us. This eve there is to
be a grand Ball here given by Machine Engine Co.
Friday 19th This morn went on board ship and packed
up what things I wanted to bring on shore. It was
hard to leave the place that has been my home
for two and a half years and I shed many
tears. But they will pass away. I must try to be
cheerful and make the best of what must
be endured. After returning from Westchester
and the kind people were anxious to go in
board so I went back with them. They were
very much pleased with the looks of the vessel.
Signed delighted with their visit. This eve
Mr. Queller has passed with us. He then has
arrived today with 250 \$ per. Capt. Keen is off
here.

Saturday 20th The Nautilus went out this morn. I watched
her from the shore. With a very bad head
George has not gone. is going today. The
Brightman was discharged yesterday P.M.
by Mutual consent. Geo. advanced him \$250.
to pay his passage home since dinner he
have been out to ride.

Sunday 21st This morn went to the Bethel. Another sermon
preached from Romans 14:14. This not go out this
eve as George had such a bad cold he could not
get able to go out.

Monday 22nd George has been quite sick all day. Has a very severe
cold. We have been down street three today. George
sent a letter to the owner today of the Queller
Emma for San Francisco. I did not write as I thought
I would not send until the I.C. Murray with the Brightman
called this eve. Capt. Keen has made his wife and daughter today.
