good. I have a very severe cold on my
lungs. Have just returned across them
and feel some better. Mrs Whitney called
today to take me in her carriage to
a meeting at First St Church. I tried
hard to think I was able to go and
get almost dressed, but felt so sick
was obliged to lie down. Mr Smolgens
called this eve brought me two late
Shipping Lists. The French Consul gave
a dinner party today the company
are still in the harbor, one gentleman
singing at the top of his voice, it is
enough to deafen one.

Thursth This morn went to Post Office with three
letters. This afternoon went to the wharf
to see the people who were going in the
Thetis. She sailed at 4 P.M. Nearly all
the boarders from this Hotel have left.
among them Dr and Mrs Spalding. Dr and
Mrs. Rule, Mr Leary and family Mr & Mrs
Glen, Mr Chapman, Rowland, Keck, Miles
and mine. The Rowland gave Estlin a
nice little wagon. This morn Estlin is
delighted with it Miss Russell has also
gone. I feel very lonely tonight. I am
alone on this floor Mr Ballin and
family having gone today and the
French Consul the Perrier, who occupies
room has moved to the Cottage at
the back of the Hotel. Will probably
have more boarders when the S.C. Wherry
arrives from S.F. He is still expected the winter
from S.F. the 28th with.
