

June 1872

June 1st This morn at ten started for the sea returned at three, covered with dust and very hot. All ~~passed off~~ ^{passed off} me of the fever has improved, one horse was quite better but I do not know the names of the horses. Mrs. Damon called tonight to ask me to be ready tomorrow morn at half past nine to go to the school examination but unless I feel better than I do tonight I shall not be able to go.

June 1st This morn was afflicted with a severe nervous headache, so I was not able to attend the Examination I lay on the lounge all the forenoon I slept a little while and my head felt better Dr. McQueen called tonight to vaccinate Mrs. Thebeck and Chise so I had Sullivan and myself vaccinated. Capt. Campbell called this eve and took a package for George, sent a long letter and a package of papers, he expects to sail tomorrow. an American ship of war arrived today two of the officers are stopping here.

June 1st It is now 11 1/2 P.M. we have just returned from an Exhibition of Oahu College. Little girl here that before the close I have just introduced him and just now is but he has asleep as soon as his head touches the pillow the ship of war St. Marks came inside the bar this morning the salute the Hawaiian flag, their salute was returned from French school here finished my white jacket and overcoat today and cut a white cotton waist.

July 14th A Cliffe Ship from San Francisco arrived this morn bringing a mail but I have rec'd nothing this afternoon. Went down street with Mrs. Thebeck. My arm is getting quite sore.

July 15th This morn received an invitation to go to the Perry, but afternoon could not go as there was not a carriage to be had. My men all engaged for the picnic or Luau as the natives call it, at Dr. Smiths at Waikiki. The Thebeck, cousin Clara, Luthie and myself then there arrived there about four and left at half past six. There was a very large gathering, but I could not eat Poi and fish. We also had roast Pig and Chicken. It was spent on the grass under the trees and all sat down native fashion and eat with their fingers. The light was sufficient for both Luthie and me. I ate a small piece of meat and drank a glass of ice water. Since I returned have had an attack of cramp in the stomach from going so long without eating and a little better here. Mothers on my stomach and am going to bed as soon as I can. Wrote a few lines to George.

July 16th This morn went to Bethel heard a sermon from Rev. Mr. Swan of Hilo, from the text often than mine eyes that I may behold precious things out of the Lord. Mrs. Davis Smith makes us have to dinner with her we accepted and remained until eight then went to look at Charles and a sermon from Rev. Mr. Swan.
