

Sept 1892

Sund 17th Have been working on Luthie's clothes here. Made one suit with the exception of buttons and buttonholes went down street to the man. Mrs. Herbert has made just to her former dress today. and dresses has made. This is the 10th anniversary of Luthie's birth. Luthie finishes Luthie's clothes and commences the third and last suit for the year. This eve went to the Bethel to sing meeting. Went down street the man. Mrs. 18th Have passed the day working on Luthie's clothes here. Nearly finished them. Nothing much record. The day has passed quietly.

Friday 20th This morn Capt. Lehto called and took me out to ride. We went to Maunien valley. enjoyed it very much. After I returned finished Luthie's clothes. This eve the Bethel choir met in my room as there was a lecture in the Bethel.

Sat 21st The Idaho from San Francisco arrives this morn. Recd a letter from Lohie and one from Ernest and one from L. The record of Capt. Crossby's severe illness appears to cannot be living at the present time. This afternoon went out and made a few calls. Then went to ride with Mr & Mrs. Lamm. This eve went to call on the Hales and Brickgum but a pleasant call.

Sun 22nd This morn went to the Bethel this eve to a Hareka Church. In the p.m. went down street. called on Mrs. Polley and Mrs. David Smith. This eve went to the theatre with a party from the Hotel. Dr. Whitman was my escort. The Dr. Perachi was just arriving 10 p.m.

Monday 23rd Have had a very busy day. Commenced packing. This morn have been down street. twice. was invited to visit Lohie to lunch but could not go. have recd several calls. from mother Black. Mr. Lohie Mrs. Lohie. Capt. Mrs. Lehto Mr. Whitman. Mrs. Lohie's children. Daret. here all. called this eve also Mr. Cartwright with his passport. I have been to the San Francisco to the Luthie's school hill. This eve is my last in Kamulala for the present. I plan to leave for Lohie but I may be called to return here. again six months hence. I have formed many pleasant acquaintances and have been treated with great kindness for which I feel very grateful.

Tues 24th Again we are out on the big day. have had a very strong heat since ever since we left port at twelve in yesterday. I was a little sick last night when I came below. nearly every one on board was sick even the Capt. Luthie has not been sick at all but still seems perfectly happy. singing about and talking to every one. Mrs. Peterson has been sick ever since leaving. Mr. Mackhouse and all his family are sick. Capt. Threlk has kinder me with great kindness. has given me the seat of honor at his right hand. he has just arrived here from the port on an canoe. We are having better weather. with a smoother sea. have gone a hundred and seventy five miles the past week. five hours. I have kept on my legs and fought and resisted by a few of the passengers have sung several hymns.
