

Sat 28th Nothing has occurred to break the monotony of life at sea. Have had pleasant weather. The Deadlock and are receiving the power of them have been on deck. We have gone to the breast and seventy miles. I have been at work on a tablet etc.

Sunday 29th This morn Mr. Rockhouse went to Episcopal service in the aft Saloon at half past ten. We have a little breeze this afternoon. Have some sail out. I have been reading a book by Charles Reade called White Lies, lent me by Capt. Russell. The Capt is a cousin of Jeff Davis was in the rebel army. He is still a stout secessionist. This eve we had a concert of sweet music. I played the Organ. We have gone a bucket yet thirty six miles this twenty four hours.

Monday 30th The last day of Sept. and we are two buckets and eight miles. Have San Francisco. Have been making on my tablet etc.

Tues Oct 1st Had a very rough night. I slept but very little. We are getting along fine. Have gone 227 miles this twenty four hours. If this wind continues shall be in N.Y. Sunday morn.

Wed 2nd Have now one week out. and are about seven hundred miles from our starting point. With a head wind and very heavy swell. I slept better last night than I ever done since I came on board. The Capt gave me a key to my door and said he felt sure I could get well on.

227 miles this twenty four hours

Thurs 3rd Have had a head wind and heavy swell have been rolling badly. Have gone 188 miles this twenty four hours. Last eve had a concert in the Saloon. Capt Russell played the Solilo. Mrs. Greenfield and I to Organ and about a dozen joined in the choruses.

Friday 4th I have felt quite sick all day and was at seven o'clock. Shall more likely retire. fear I am going to have an attack of camp in the stomach. We have gone 186 miles this twenty four hours. It has been quite rough.

Sat 5th I have been in bed all day quite sick. tonight feel a little better but am in bed still. We have gone 188 miles and now two buckets and forty four miles.

Sun 6th We arrived at 4 P.M. Capt Russell sends a carriage for me and I am now at the Chase House. Have been writing all the eve. Have written to Mrs. Daniel Smith, Mrs. Herbert Lohr, William Bluebird & Co. Miss Parsell called this eve. Capt Russell has promised to call before he sails expects to sail Wednesday at 12 M.

Mon 7th Was agreeably surprised this morn by a letter from J. H. Potter of New Bedford he was very kind brought me two papers to read. Went down to Williams & Thompson & Co. and got me two letters. Jas called again this eve with his wife. Capt Chapman called this morn told me the Scandalous was reported by the North 400 Bbls but as Mr. Potter has not heard anything of the report that he must have been a mistake. Mrs. Thompson called this eve. He told me of his four brothers and sisters although a very sad subject yet it was a
