Sunday 1<sup>st</sup> Have had a pleasant day but the wind  
SE 23, 45 continues light. Have seen 1 C. V. Hawks  
Larg 4488 Albatross and Skiff sails

Monday 2<sup>nd</sup> The coast is in sight have seen whales  
several times but neither Humpbacks  
X Grubbs or Sulphur Bottoms. Several  
for Humpbacks but they were going  
SE 23, 13' so fast and we had no wind could  
Sail 11, 13' but get near them. (Caulius) Vatares one  
of the Boatmen is quite sick  
I have spent the day making up my  
truss

Tuesday 3<sup>rd</sup> Have spent the day working on my truss  
1854 and trying to get my sewing machine in  
working order. I finished the dress  
Sat 22, 34 at five o'clock. But the machine again  
Eng 10, 66 & work. In sight Cape Lucas and  
saw the Chronometer about eight  
lengths a sail can be seen across  
a long distance off. but a little  
hazy this morn but it sun clear  
and and is almost a calm.

Wednesday 4<sup>th</sup> This morn commenced making up my  
Sat 22, 20 Japanese silk dress. Here up it all  
Eng 10, 41 up. Wind it and cut and packed a  
1856 Princess Polonaise. It is a good thing  
but makes a great evening dress. Have  
seen a Steamer and schooner from

1856 Masthead Tally  
Thursday 5<sup>th</sup> Sunset for Botolph's this morn immediately  
after breakfast but they were very shy  
Sat 24, 2 Capt Smith went down to the  
Eng 10, 47 men for Boatmen. as Caulius was not  
able to go. Capt got one the other one  
un Maria I chased until near noon but could not  
strike. I spent the morn watching the boats and  
the afternoon writing on my (Polonaise).
