I have been out down street with Mrs. Reed. Capt. R. gave me a bottle of Peppermint. Mrs. Reed sent small articles that I wanted to purchase of her. I am very sorry this is going home. The Board meet in the night this evening and invitation to attend a service in the First St. Church but this not accept.

Lundy 11th Mrs. Dakota's sister for 9.45

This is just Lundy the Catholics and Episcopals are consequently very busy attending church services. Lundy went to morning service. We went to the lecture with Mrs. Kim. Mrs. Dr. Smith called today. This eve. Capt. Thomas, Fisher, Mitchell, called also Mrs. Coppersmith. I mailed seven letters today. To Lober, Katie, Jackson Allen, Amy, Mr. Daugherty, and Electrician Linder. Mrs. Hubbard gave Capt. Thomas sailed this afternoon. George and I went to call on Capt. and Mrs. Cleten. He had a severe fall on Tuesday but is now much better. We took Lundy from Capt. McElroy's where he was passing the day. Then went for a short drive returned and took dinner. Then to Emma Sympson to hear the Branch. This eve called on Father Daigneard, and Mrs. Dr. Smith, with a Mr. Villanov.

Paster Lundy 12th

This morning went to the Bethel. It was very warm. Mr. Dummer preached from Romans 8:24 f.c. after dinner we called on Capt. Oak. Mr. Rice, Mr. Duncan, and Mr. Bell's. Then went to First St. Church. Capt. Reed called this afternoon.

Monday 14th Capt. got the Martha's outside this morning but he has not gone, as several of the men have deserted and he must wait to find them or get others. This eve we have seen the a visitation in Buffum's Hall given by H. C. Demarest son of MacLennan, Democrat of New York.

Tues 15th Went down street with Lundy this morning. Went down again with Mrs. Herbert. Mrs. Whiting called this morning. I have felt badly all day, yet unwilling to acknowledge it. Have tried to go out but have a very severe back. The wind is blowing a gale, and the Martha's is very bad for the ships outside. There are six to be seen from the observatory. The Committee has sailed today.

Wednes 16th Went down street this afternoon with Mrs. Herbert. got some card to put up my pictures and when I came home my watch ran in my room. Lundy returned from school while I was away, and left his lunch jar and started off to play at five o'clock. I went to look for him walked some time but did not find him. and then his father went to look for him but he succeeded in getting him about six. He returned. Last seen to William Parks to play. I told him he must not go out by even again tonight but finally consented to his doing with us as this is the last night his father will be here for a long time. Mr. Hollister sailed today. Again I am alone with Lundy. Oh what a long lonely day I have passed. George left the Hotel at half past ten this morning. I
