Mrs Lewis called this afternoon. This morning went to Sunday school and took the same class I had last year. My all seemed very glad to see me again. Left and Mrs Owen again this afternoon. James was here when I returned from school.

they are stopping here in the Hotel. I think Mrs Owen will remain here. Mrs Black came up this afternoon and Mrs Herbert invited her to dine with us. She did so and went with Lullie to East St. Church this eve. Lullie was very badly so I had to come out. Have finished a letter to send to Geo by Capt Relford, and will now try to write another to send by Capt Serg. Both vessels sail tomorrow. This morning went down street with Mrs Owen this afternoon have been cutting a cleaning maffes. Mr & Mrs Duncan and Capt and Mrs Owen have called this eve. I have been writing letters to send home have written Mr Peole, Cousin Charlie Pigeon, Lillian, Katie Melton, and Edwin Allen. Shall send them by Capt Turnbull who goes via the J. A. Walker Reg. Takes few Portland Oregon Capt Turnbull himself offered to take letters for me and mail them as soon as he arrives. The Josephine, Long and General Harny Relford left today I sent a letter by each.

Tues 22nd

This morning went down on board the fish Perry with Capt and Mrs Owen returned and put in on my maffes until three then dressed for Lullie and myself and made a call on Mrs Dr Smith, and then went to Mrs Davis Smith's. This eve Capt and Mrs Owen and Capt & Mrs Gullett have been in my room.
