Just before the meeting the alarm of fire was given and we rushed into the street. It was to be the house of H. McCallum. The Governor of Hawaii, it went up everything in the house, and a part of a small house in the street. The descent of water prevented its being extinguished. Immediately the loss in circumstances and valuable is very great. Mr B and I went as far as Mr Cartwright's there some Benjamin L. and some up in the looking. We saw the house when it fell in.

Thurs 16th Spent the morn at home. We called from Capt Langbein in the p.m. and from Mrs Hester and Mr Ladd this afternoon. Just before dinner went with Mrs O'Brien to call on Mrs Baine. The first time I have called since the death of her child nearly two months ago. Dr. Threlkeld was there. So the heart did not glay. Mrs Duncan and her

Frid 17th Have passed the day at home. Have finished up slipped case, and made a collar. This eve Mr Whitman and family called for a drive to the beach as Mrs Dillingham could not attend. I went with them. Mr Whitman and Helen Whiting came home with me.

Sat 18th Have passed the day at the beach with Mrs De Smith. There was quite a party. Mrs Herbert and child. Mrs McLean and two children. Mrs Whiting and Helen and two younger children. Miss Ennis Clara Herbert Mrs De Smith and five children and Betty and myself.

Sun 19th We spent a very pleasant day. There was quite an excitement. The morn about a steamer that was telegraphed. It seemed to be the U.S.S. Esmeralda with Admiral Panamuk, wife and staff. It brought a small mail. I rec'd a letter from Geo. and I Allen and Dan. Went to Bethel this morn. and that is this eve.

Mon 20th Have passed the day at home working and doing odd jobs.

Tues 21st Went down street this morn. This P.m. at three o'clock with Mrs Black Clara and Mr Whitman to go for a horseback ride around dinner. But Clara has been run away with her and there was no go. We did not get far. Clara is badly bruised but not seriously injured. Dr. D.C. Murray arrived today. I rec'd no letter. Mrs. Robinson came also several others who are expected here.
