Sat 1st This morn discovered a signal on Telegraph Wharf it is to be a Whaler. Thought it the New Orleans but it is not. Capt. Miller thought it was the Huntley but it is not. It is the New Bern. Capt. Allen called this eve. reports the Marbles sailing Sept 28, but did not speak to me. Mr. and Mrs. Damon called this eve and with me to ride. Mr. and Mrs. Black called this eve. Mrs. Shaw & Mrs. O'Callaghan called.

Sun 2nd This morn went early to the Observatory and again just before going to Sunday School. Saw nothing but when we got to Bethel found there was a whaler telegraphed. I stopped to smoke. School did come home before morning service. We are thought it the Huntley. I just lost it. I saw saw that it was not her signal. It proved to be the Active. Capt. Campbell called this afternoon. has only seen the Marbles for a long time. This eve went to St. St. with Mrs. Black.

Sunday 3rd Have spent the most of the day watching telegraph bill. but have seen nothing. Mrs. Damon Mrs. Green and their children Mrs. Stirling called this afternoon. This eve Mr. Herbert had his carriage brought to the door for Mrs. Robinson and myself to take a ride. I drove took Annie with me. Was gone about an hour.

Mon 4th Capt. Campbell called this morn and invited Mrs. & I to go to an entertainment at Bu. Jones. After getting ready we accepted and were just returned. Mrs. Herbert, Mrs. Robinson and myself passed the day at Capt. David Smith's. The same morn. after school. The Herbert and O'Callaghan came out to tea and brought a home. I have watched the Marbles poles carefully but there has been nothing telegraphed to me. have been very rainy. Oh, I sincerely hope some of the whalers will arrive. I am getting impatient and impatient.

Tues 5th The Northern Light arrived this morn also the Starway and Jane & son. Capt. Smith got to the Hotel about eight o'clock. has not seen the Marbles for a long time. I have not seen Capt. O'Callaghan of the Starway but hear that he reports the Marbles with four whales. The N. Light has 750 Blb. Jane & son 2 whales and a little walrus. The Starway clear. The reports from the most of the vessels is good more favorable than the first. This eve went to the Bethel. Mrs. Black called and went and returned with me.

Thurs 6th The Josephine arrived this morn with Mrs. Blb. reports the Marbles with three whales taken after the gale. the Illinois with five the O'Callaghan six all taken late. The Irish Hoss with 1200 Blb. Mrs. Herbert and I have been making calls today. called on Mrs. Peterson Mrs. Hager and Mrs. Stirling Mrs. Friedman. Mrs. Rice Mrs.
