Tue 6th There had a very unpleasant day, at noon Mr. David Smith ^{sent} with his carriage to take take Mrs. Stanger and I to find the afternoon we went but it rained all

Wed 7th The afternoon our husbands came to tea and I added the eve. Lillian went with me. We returned about half past nine. Another stormy morning, but better weather this afternoon and eve. Went out to the Insane Asylum and passed the afternoon. Mr. Davis called for us and brought me back. Went to Bethel this eve.

Thurs 8th The weather has been very bad all day. Mr. Price the American printer for a ball this eve. We were invited and should have gone if the weather had been pleasant, but it has rained all day and still continues to do so. The seals are very muddy and I but rather remain at home than go out in such bad weather. The friends met James Allen. Went yesterday. The Amos married here gone but it was so rough the day could not take her out.

Fri 9th The weather still continues very bad. Mrs. Mc Kenzie called this morn. Captain Mrs. Stanger and Capt. Fisher called this eve. Mrs. Whitman called and took me to rehearsal. Mrs. Black returned with me.

Sat 10th Went down street this morn although the weather was so but it was hardly suitable.
