Saturday July 4th All of these 24 hours light breeze from
S. East part fog latter part clear and
a plenty of W. heads we lowered several times
without success. Several miles insight.

Sunday July 5th All of these 24 hours
light air and calm midale part fog
a plenty of whales all around. We lowered
a times without success. At 5 AM lowered
and struck. By 11 PM had him alongside
at 3 am. commenced cutting and finished
by 12 noon. Lat by Obs 61. 47. N.
Long. Chron 179. 56. W.

Monday July 5th These 24 hours fog
part light S.W. by breeze midale and
latter part midale from N.W. to W. Strongly
in a boiling besides us. No whales insight.
Lat by Obs 62. 04. N.
Long. Chron 179. 56. W.

Tuesday July 6th These 24 hours light
breeze from S.E. to W. with calm and
fog we saw a few whales a going quick
along the ice ship laying off and on employed
a boiling.

Wednesday July 7th These 24 hours first
part fog midale and latter part clear weather
at times. We finished a boiling at night
at 6 am commenced storming dam. in main
haleway. The day ends with strong breeze
a laying off and on the ice employed in boiling.

Thursday July 8th All of these 24 hours fresh
breeze from S.E. to W. with thick fog ship under
double reefed topsails laying off and on the ice
We finished storming dam 75 W. at. in main hatching.

Friday July 9th All of these 24 hours
fresh breeze from S.E. to W. ship
under double reefed topsails. Thick fog all
through the day. Employed in scraping ice.

Saturday July 10th All of these 24 hours
quite strong breeze from S.W. with thick fog
ship under double reefed topsails a laying off
and on. Lat by Obs 62. 26. N.
Long. Chron 179. 22. W.

Sunday July 11th All of these 24 hours
fresh breeze from Southward with more
fog. Lat by Obs 62. 28. N.
Long. Chron 179. 54. E.
