

Monday July 10

These 24 hours first part light breeze from E. S. W. middle and latter parts moderate breeze from E. S. W. At 6 A.M. we took a skinner alongside. He was anchored with two anchors and the lines that was in him was marked. E. W. At 12 noon finished cutting latter part light rain. Spike ship American and Black Fortune

Tuesday July 11

All of these 24 hours moderate winds from E. S. W. with light rains and chills of fog. Hauling S. by E. on one tack and and S. by E. on the other under short sail employed in sailing.

Wednesday July 12

The first and middle parts of these 24 hours light winds from E. S. W. with thick fog latter part fair weather and winds from N. E. S. W. whale a going quick. Spike ship Warren of Boston. Made four whales this season. Finished sailing at 7 A.M.

Sat by the 6.20 M.

Long. Lat. 177.50. N.

Thursday July 13

First and middle parts winds from N. to E. S. W. latter parts strong winds from E. S. W. Ship under close reefed main topsail and foresail. Hauling dam in main hatchway.

Friday July 14

The first part fresh gales from E. S. W. under double reefed topsails and foresail. Employed in hauling dam in main hatchway 100 lbs.

Saturday July 15

These 24 hours light breeze from N. W. to S. W. steering N. E. S. W. with fair weather. Saw several sails some bound North and some bound South. The day ended with land still in sight. Sat by the 6.30 M.

Sunday July 16

These 24 hours moderate breeze from S. W. to N. E. latter part from S. to N. E. weather quite fair. At 4 P.M. lowered for a Bon Head whale and W. B. Strick by 6 P.M. had him alongside. Commenced cutting and by 12 noon all through and sailing.

Monday July 17

These 24 hours commenced with light N. E. S. W. breeze. Middle part calm. Latter part strong winds from S. W. land in sight. Hauling N. W. S. W. lowered for Bon Heads and W. B. Strick and cut from him. The boatmen said the line was foul. Employed in sailing several sails in sight a chasing. Sat by the 6.40 M.

Tuesday July 18

These 24 hours strong winds from S. W. to N. E. At 6 A.M. lowered for Bon Heads and W. B. Strick by 6 A.M. had him alongside and through cutting at 12 noon. Land in sight.
